What is a conservancy?

A conservancy is a voluntary agreement between landowners to cooperate towards the conservation of the environment on their combined properties. There are three conservancies within the greater Wilderness area

Touws River Conservancy

Aims to conserve the natural assets of the Greater Wilderness Area, in partnership with all its people, for the benefit and enjoyment of present and future.

Constantia Kloof Conservancy

Established to protect the area encompassed by the Constantia Kloof development and promote environmental awareness among the residents and visitors of Wilderness.

Paradise Ridge Conservancy

Actively encourages the property owners in Paradise Ridge to manage their land in a way that conserves and nurtures the natural fauna and flora of the area
