RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please read and obey all posted rules and instructions from our staff. Our Aquatics Team are highly trained and qualified.



DREAMWORKS

All persons shall shower before entering the water. Take a shower after any attraction closure and after using the pool.



Guests must wash their hands using soap after using the restroom and changing diapers.



All children in diapers must wear diapers specifically designed for immersion in water (such as swimming diapers). Do no wash out soiled diapers in the bathing water. Complimentary child swim diapers are provided at Guest Services.



No animals, except for service animals, shall be allowed in the swimming pool, wading pool, hot tub, or spa area, dressing rooms, or other parts of the enclosure. Pets are not allowed.



Proper swim attire is required. Swim attire is defined as a one or two-piece swimsuit. Pants, denim, wetsuits, thongs, or transparent clothing is not permitted. Other swim attire specifically designed for aquatic use is permitted – Please speak with an Aquatics Supervisor. We reserve the right to determine the appropriateness of swim attire.



Only US Coast Guard approved lifejackets/PFDs are permitted in designated pools and slides. Complimentary PFDs are available across the park.



For guests' safety, all minimum and maximum height/weight requirements will be enforced.



Recommended maximum time in hot tub: 10 minutes.



Maximum temperature of hot tub: 104°F.

ATTENTION PARENTS

Children under 14 years of age must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. A Supervising Companion must be at least 14 years of age and have the ability to assist the child in complying with instructions.

OTHER INFORMATION

DreamWorks Water Park is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen property. Maximum bather load for wavepool and hot tubs posted on attraction entrance signs. First Aid supplies can be obtained at our first aid center or by speaking to our Aquatic Team.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

A person injured in the Water Park must provide a written notice of the accident or injury to the Water Park within 90 days of the date of the incident giving rise to the injury. This is a precondition to bringing a personal injury suit in connection with the injury against a Water Park operator. Failure to provide the required notice within 90 days may result in the dismissal of your claim. Accidents may be reported at the First Aid Office. Source: N.J.S. 5:3-57. Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others is prohibited.

New Jersey law prohibits a rider from using, entering or boarding, or attempting to use, enter or board, any attraction if he/she is knowingly under the influence of any alcoholic beverage or any prescription, drug or controlled dangerous substance or any other substance which may affect his/her ability to use it safely and abide by all posted and stated instructions. New Jersey law permits the park owner/operator to prevent a rider who is perceptibly or apparently under the influence of drugs or alcohol from riding on an amusement ride. Source: N.J.S. 5:3-56; N.J.A.C. § 5:14A-3.3. New Jersey law permits the park owner/operator to refuse admission to the park or any attraction by any patron or other member of the public: (a) whose bearing or conduct might endanger himself/herself or any other patron or other member of the public; (b) whose health or physical condition makes use thereof by him/her unsafe for him/her; or (c) who cannot meet a companion or height restriction for any attraction subject to such a restriction. 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Floors, steps and ramps may become slippery when wet. Use caution at all times and hold handrails when possible. No running or horseplay.



Prolonged exposure to chlorine may cause irritation to those with sensitive skin or other medical conditions. Showering and taking breaks may help prevent irritation.





Street shoes must not be worn in wet traffic areas.



No guest shall use the pool if the person has been instructed not to do so by a regional health authority or a physician.



Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be prohibited from entering the water and/or using any attraction.



Swim attire with metal buttons, buckles, rivets, zippers, or sharp objects are not permitted on any slide or attraction.



Diving masks, snorkels, water wings, outside inflatables, mermaid tails and fins are not permitted.



No outside food, drinks, or alcohol is permitted.



Glass containers shall be prohibited in food and drink areas.



Recording devices (cell phones, GoPro cameras, etc.) are not permitted on waterslides/attractions, inside pools, or within any changing facility.



Loose articles including purses, jewelry, rings, necklaces, lanyards and recording/photo devices (phones, GoPro/action cameras, etc.) are not permitted on waterslides/attractions. Eyeglasses must be secured with a strap.



No guest shall urinate or defecate in, or otherwise pollute the pool. Do not wash out soiled diapers in the bathing waters. Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the water. Immediately report any "accidents" you observe to a member of our Aquatic Team.

HEALTH CONDITIONS & SAFETY



Guests with the following conditions should not ride: Expectant mothers. Recent surgery or other conditions that may be aggravated by this ride, including guests with casts or support braces. Heart conditions, epilepsy or abnormal blood pressure. Back, neck or similar physical problems. Motion sickness or dizziness. Fear of enclosed spaces. Sensitivity to loud sounds.

Any person showing evidence of any communicable skin disease, sore or inflamed eyes, cold, nasal or ear discharges, or any other communicable disease shall be denied admission. Any person with excessive sunburn, open blisters, cuts or bandages shall be denied admission. Do not enter the water if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had any signs or symptoms of a gastrointestinal (stomach) disease in the past seven days.

Guests with the following conditions should consult a physician prior to using the hot tubs: Expectant mothers. Persons greater than 65 years of age. Persons with medical conditions requiring ongoing care of a physician, including heart disease, hypertension, seizures, diabetes and obesity.

PATRON RESPONSIBILITY

Participate responsibly! You should be in good health to ride. You know your physical conditions and limitations, DreamWorks Water Park does not. If you suspect your health could be at risk for any reason or you could aggravate a pre-existing condition of any kind, please do not ride. State law requires that each rider must obey all written warnings and directions regarding this ride and refrain from behaving in a reckless manner which may cause or contribute to injury to the rider or others. Failure to comply is a violation of law and subject to penalty under the New Jersey Code of Criminal Justice pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:3-36.1. Violators may be subject to a fine of up to \$1,000 and imprisonment of up to six months.
