Introducing the 2023 Students Rebuild Welcoming Refugees Project

No matter what we believe, where we live, or who we are, we are all part of one global community. This year, we're inviting students from around the world to join us in learning about refugees and the local actions we can take to make our communities more welcoming and inclusive through art.

Together, we're teaching students about refugee crises and how small actions can make a big difference. By creating a postcard that will be sent to young refugees around the world, students can raise up to \$1.6M for this year's Students Rebuild partners who are helping to change the lives of displaced families from Ukraine, Ethiopia, Turkey, and more.

How to Get Involved

Take three simple but powerful steps to help your students deepen their empathy for their global neighbors, and turn that empathy into action:

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- 1 Dig deep!** Students can learn about welcoming refugees in your community and around the world, and begin to draw inspiration for their art. We provide the lessons and content guides.
 - 2 Let's create!** When students create art for someone else, they're all in—mind, body, and spirit. Students can create a work of art welcoming refugees that reflects culture, community and connection. This year, we'll be making artfully illustrated postcards to welcome our new refugee friends!
 - 3 We're almost there!** Send your artwork to us. For each piece of art Students Rebuild receives, the Bezos Family Foundation will make a \$5 donation—up to \$1.6 million—to organizations providing humanitarian relief around the world.
