- Support the development and successful delivery of regulatory applications and compliance filings related to thermal energy utility rate design, revenue requirements, capital projects (including Certificate for Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) applications), and long-term resource planning.
- Collaborate cross-functionally to support the Regulatory team in developing regulatory strategy, to advise and manage the development of business cases and evidence that advances Creative Energy's utility objectives and obligations.
- Monitor and resolve emergent regulatory issues and compliance matters.
- Support customer and stakeholder consultation required in support of regulatory proceedings, ensuring arrangements are made as needed and required records are maintained.
