Dr. Katrien Palmers, Equine Clinic De Morette, Belgium (DVM, ECEIM Diplomate)

graduated at Ghent University in 2005 with a keen interest in Equine Internal Medicine. Even if there were almost no specialty programs in Europe at that time, she was persuaded this was her way to go. An internship, a year in ambulatory practice and referral work in renowned equine hospitals as De Bosdreef and De Morette were the stepping stones towards the specialist title of the ECEIM. Since then she has been leading the internal medicine department of Equine Hospital De Morette and since joining the “Equine care group” she became Head of Internal Medicine of the entire group.

Dr. Giorgio Corraetti, Veterinary Hospital University of Milan (DVM, ECVS Diplomate, CertAMP(ESO))

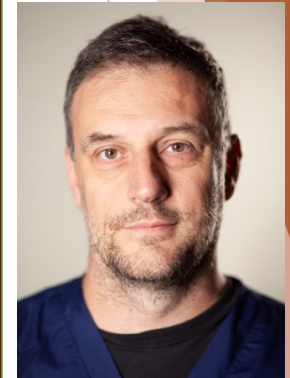
graduated at the University of Perugia. Worked in Belgium, Holland and England, mainly in the field of orthopedics and equine surgery. After completing a residency in large animal surgery in Belgium, at the De Morette equine clinic, he obtained the Certificate in Equine Orthopedic Surgery at the University of Liverpool, and became an ECVS diplomate.

Prof. Davide Zani, University of Milan (DVM, PhD, Associate Professor)

graduated in 2001 from the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine in Milan and began his career as an equine veterinarian, working until 2005 at the Spirano Veterinary Clinic (Dr. Massimo Magri.) In 2009 he completed his PhD with a thesis on the use of magnetic resonance imaging to evaluate cartilage lesions in the horse's fetlock joint. In 2009 he obtained a Researcher position at the Faculty, and currently is Associate Professor at the Department of Veterinary Medicine and Animal Sciences at the University of Milan. He leads the equine surgical clinic course, the diagnostic imaging course for equine patients, and the course on elements of podiatry and farriery within the degree program in Animal Husbandry and Welfare of Companion Animals. Since 2017, he has been in charge of the Diagnostic Imaging department of the Veterinary Hospital, which operates 24/7 and receives over 2100 patients annually. He has authored over 80 indexed works on various aspects of diagnostic imaging in the equine field, farm animals, companion animals, unconventional animals, and in translational experimental medicine, as well as works presented at various national and international events.

Dr. Martina Amari, University of Milan (DVM, PhD student)

Doctor Martina Amari graduated with honors at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Milan in 2019. In 2020 she continued her collaboration with the University of Milan performing anaesthesia and analgesia of small and large animals, unconventional, zoo and wild animals and laboratory animals. Since 2022 she is a PhD student at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Milan, with a research project on pain management in horses.

Dr. Kajsa Gustafsson, University of Milan (DVM, ECVS Diplomate, PhD student)

graduated from Warsaw university in 2015 and worked shortly in Sweden before pursuing a rotating equine clinical internship in the University of Dublin. She then completed a 3-year ECVS Large animal surgical residency in the Koret school of veterinary medicine in Tel Aviv, Israel. After the completion of the residency she has been working as an equine surgeon in Belgium, Sweden and Portugal before arriving to the University of Milan to work as a surgeon in the equine unit and pursue a PhD in imaging diagnostics.

Dr. Monica Probo, University of Milan (DVM, PhD, ECAR Diplomate)

graduated in 2008, and completed her PhD in 2012, with a 6-month externship at the Reproduction department of Ghent University. In 2016 she became a diplomate of ECAR college. She's currently working as Research fellow at the Department of Veterinary Medicine and Animal Sciences of the University of Milan, with main focus on large animal reproduction.

Dr. Francesca Cavallier, University of Milan (DVM, MRCVS, Equine Medicine and Surgery Specialization student)

graduated in veterinary medicine in the 2018 at the University of Milan. In the 2020 became a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeon and she spent 3 years in the UK at the Pool House Equine Clinic. She completed a 24-months Equine Veterinary Internship and then became a 'junior clinician' in the same equine practice. During this period she developed a strong interest in lameness investigation and surgeries. In April 2021 Francesca came back in Italy and since then she is working like a freelance equine veterinarian. In the 2022 she obtained the RCVS Certificate in Advanced Veterinary Practice at the University of Liverpool and since 2023 she is collaborating with the equine department of the University of Milan.
