Event venue:

Comet Meetings – Louise

The venue is centrally located and only a few walking minutes away from the metro station “Louise”. You can also take one of the trams to the station “Stéphanie” and walk from there. At the venue, you will be welcomed by the Comet staff, who will describe to you the way to the event room. Additionally, signs will indicate the way to the room. You will be able to use the elevator behind the reception. At the venue, you will have access to the event venue including breakfast, lunch, and coffee breaks as well as the concluding networking reception. Please beware that there is only limited space available for storing your luggage, so if you can, leave them at the hotel.



Travel recommendations

By plane:

From Brussels Airport (Zaventem):

The easiest way to reach Comet Louise from Brussels Airport (Zaventem) is by taking a taxi or an airport shuttle. A taxi ride takes approximately 30-35 minutes, depending on traffic, and costs around 40-50€. Alternatively, you can take the train from the airport to Gare du Midi and then transfer to metro line 2 or 6 to Louise Station (Direction "Elisabeth"). From there, it's a 5-minute walk to Comet Louise or you can take the tram 92 with direction "Fort-Jaco", 93 "Legrand" or 8 "Roodebeek" for one stop.

From Brussels South Charleroi Airport:

If you arrive at Brussels South Charleroi Airport, the best way to reach Comet Louise is by taking the Brussels City Shuttle or Flibco shuttle bus to Gare du Midi. From there, you can take metro line 2 or 6 to Louise Station (Direction "Elisabeth"), which is only a 5-minute walk from the location or the tram 92 with direction "Fort-Jaco", 93 "Legrand" or 8 "Roodebeek" for one stop. Alternatively, we can recommend the taxis service gvtaxi (<http://www.gvtaxi.com/en.html>) to book a transport from the airport directly to the venue.

By train/public transport:

From Gare du Midi Station:

To reach Comet Louise from Gare du Midi, take metro line 2 or 6 to Louise Station (Direction "Elisabeth"), which is just a 5-minute walk away from the location. Alternatively, you can also take the tram 92 with direction "Fort-Jaco", 93 "Legrand" or 8 "Roodebeek" for one stop.

From Arts-Loi Station:

From Arts-Loi station, you can take the metro lines 2 and 6 in the direction "Simonis" until "Louise" Station. From there either take a 5-minute walk or take the tram 92 with direction "Fort-Jaco", 93 "Legrand" or 8 "Roodebeek" for one stop.

By car:

If you're driving to Comet Louise, the venue recommends the following parking spaces:

- Inter-Parking Stéphanie; Avenue Louise 83, 1060 Bruxelles
- ZenPark Parking; Rue Dejoncker 36 1060 Bruxelles
- Q-Park Parking; Rue Capitaine Crespel 27, 1050 Bruxelles

Grand Place (central square of Brussels, surrounded by opulent Baroque guildhalls)



Galleries Royales Saint Hubert (ensemble of three glazed shopping arcades, close to the Grand Place)



Atomium (landmark modernist building, originally constructed as the centrepiece of the 1958 Brussels World's Fair)



St. Michael and St. Gudula Cathedral (medieval Roman Catholic cathedral dedicated to the patron saints of the city)



Royal Palace (the official palace of the King and Queen of the Belgians, situated in front of Brussels Park, Brussels largest public park)



Manneken Pis (landmark bronze fountain statue that is regularly dressed up. Its wardrobe consists of around one thousand different costumes)
