## ON ISLAND OPEN GARDEN TOURS

### OPEN GARDEN AT THE HOME OF

#### JEANETTE WRENSHALL

**Sunday, July 16<sup>TH</sup> 1:00-3:00pm—457 Cowan Road**

Please join us on July 16<sup>th</sup> for our 4th Open Garden of the 2017 season. Jeanette calls her property a permaculture food forest and it is a definite “must see” for all those interested in growing their own food. Although the address is 457 Cowan Road, the access is via Salal. Turn left off of Sunset onto Salal and drive to the very end of the paved road. Please park at the turn-around where the pavement ends and either wait for the shuttle or follow the signs and walk along the 400 meter easement to Jeanette’s home. Sturdy shoes are recommended.

Jeanette writes:

We bought our off-grid property in August 2014 after searching for years off island for something that we’d never thought we’d be able to find on Bowen. So it was our good fortune to find an on island property with a derelict cabin at a price that was manageable.

Our property is just over 6 acres with old growth forests, one large pond with a rock bluff, 2 smaller ponds and lots of room for growing food.

Incredibly, the soil is more than 6 feet deep in places and there is enough southern exposure for fruiting trees.

The cabin of 672 square feet, was built in the 1950’s and was considered by most to be a tear down. We gutted and restored it to our liking, but maintained the original footprint.

Solar panels, a soon to come water turbine, batteries, and a generator give us all the power we need. We miss nothing of our previous way of living. In fact, we love being free from hydro bills.

When presented with enough land to grow food, I decided to create an organic, permaculture food forest. It’s an ancient way of providing a sustainable food supply for our family. I have planted fruit and nut trees, vines, berries, annual and perennial veggies, pollinator plants, medicinal, ground covers, fuel for heat, and fodder for our chickens.

The property backs onto the Bowen ecological reserve which rises another 600 feet and provides me with the challenge of managing the winter water flow.

Berms and swales slow down the water to keep it on the land as long as possible.

The goal is long term with high output required in the first few years of setting up and with, hopefully, less work re-

quired over time.

Last year I started the first section of a food forest which is doing well. This year I have added another section with yet another to come next year in the already prepared hugels. Approximately an acre and a half will be devoted to good growing.

Diana and Michael write:

We moved to Bowen in March of 2006. To say that the garden of our new home was wild, neglected, sad, and totally unloved would be an understatement. During the past 11 years, we have had rock walls built, laid patios, created numerous flower beds, and have had many loads of soil, bark mulch, rock, and edging rocks come through our gates. Indeed, a new deck has just been finished ocean side.

Though we consider our garden a spring garden, in the fall, there is still lots of color. We enjoy many hydrangeas plus a large variety of dahlias lovingly lifted and stored away each winter. Roses continue to bloom and there are corners of the garden where one can sit and while away the hours (when not weeding, dead heading and picking the veggies.) We have had many raised beds installed and enjoy the fruits of our labour all summer and into the fall. On the water side, we reclaimed and exposed elements of the rock. In a quiet corner facing west, we have a small orchard of apple and plum trees, along with a very old honeysuckle which threatens to take over the entire arbour.

Ours is a friendship garden--a product of many cuttings and offerings generously given by friends. In addition to the floral aspect, we have created a peaceful haven for birds. In the spring, robins nest and feed their young along with the chickadees who commandeer the nesting box. We are host to northern flickers, thrushes, siskin, and hummingbirds who seem to have taken note of our address. This is a garden to rest your soul. So, please take a moment to breathe in the sea air, admire the view, walk barefoot on the lush carpet of grass, listen to the wind, the bird song and wind chimes. In essence, lose yourself in nature – Welcome and Enjoy.....
