***Bokashi* Composting: An Alternative Method of Composting Food Waste**



On May 16, 2016 the Bowen Island Garden Club welcomes Nick Kiss of ***Bokashi Living*** who will give us a presentation on *Bokashi* composting as an alternative to traditional composting methods of food waste. The presentation will

begin with an introduction to composting in general, a discussion of how it works, why the soils benefit from it and how composting helps our gardens to flourish. More specifically, Nick will discuss *Bokashi* composting , a faster, easier, and more enjoyable method for the composting of all food waste. *Bokashi* is a method that does not attract rodents and will transform food scraps into microbe and nutrient rich compost in just 4 to 6 weeks. *Bokashi* composting not only keeps our food waste local, it turns it into nutrient rich soils for our Bowen Island gardens. For those of you who can't wait to get started *Bokashi* composting Nick will have a few kits available for purchase!

Please join us at The Gallery at Artisan Square on **May 16, 2016 at 7 PM** our only evening speaker event of the year! Everyone is welcome, non-members only \$3.00. Those of you who can't make day time meetings this is an opportunity to learn about a very important topic and to get to know the garden club. A *Bokashi* Kit will be raffled at the meeting!!

Please join us on May 29th for another fabulous Open Garden at the home of Luke Wang and Rob Dufty. Members of the Garden Club first visited this garden 6 years ago and were deeply impressed with the beauty and variety of exotic and unusual plants. Since then, Luke and Rob have continued to expand and change their garden. The following is the write up submitted by Luke and Rob.

THE GROWING AFFAIR

The two started their growing affair in 2002 on an east-facing balcony in Yale town where the sight of white strawberry and clematis against a backdrop of Mount Baker and Burrard Inlet brought them much joy. Still wondering why, in 2004, they brought their growing affair to Bluewater on Bowen Island where a half acre half blank canvas allowed them to create and experiment-one shovel at a time and, sometimes two, not sure if it was because of impatience or excitement.

Coming from very different climates, the Canadian Prairie and Southeast China, the two set their minds on finding plants from all corners of the earth that would thrive in the Pacific Northwest. Their first plant was the Chinese Dove Tree, which will take up to 15 years to bloom. This was followed by plants like the Katsura Japanese Maple, the Spanish Fir, the Giant Himalayan Lily, the South American Monkey Puzzle, and the Eurasian Molly-the-Witch, just to name a few.

To add life to their garden, the two hand-dug a 5,000 gallon pond which became the centre piece. The growing affair then expanded from land to water as the pond gradually became home to

dozens of Koi, Goldfish, and Rosey Minnows and now sustains a sizeable population of the native Red-legged Frog, Dragonflies and Damselflies, as well as some unwelcome visitors such as the Great Blue Heron, the King Fisher, and recently, a River Otter.

The garden features fragrance from flowering shrubs including Wintersweet and Witch Hazel in the winter, the elegance of six Magnolia varieties and over a dozen tree and herbaceous Peony species in the spring, the towering and heavenly scented Giant Himalayan Lily in the summer, and the vibrant colours of both Japanese and native Maples in the fall.

The two have also enjoyed experimenting with year-round displays of structure, texture, form, and colour through various plant combinations.

After seven years, the Giant Himalayan Lily did bloom as anticipated, and patiently, the two continue to await the first blossom of the Chinese Dove Tree. Nonetheless, the growing affair happily continues.....still not sure why.

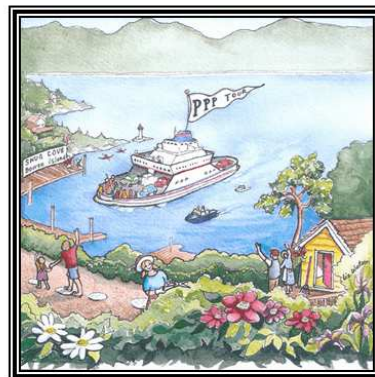
