PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Thank you for the opportunity to act as your President. It is a nice repeat prospect for me. My previous time in this position was 2009 and 2010.

It is nice to see some new faces on the Executive and also see the continuity provided by several longstanding board members. I deeply miss my interactions with Sharon Haggerty who gave so much to the Garden Club, first in her role as the Cuttings Editor and more recently as our Club President. I know one of her final major activities was handling the distribution of the daffodils purchased by Club members. I was not available on the formal allocation day but she cheerfully stashed mine, and those of a neighbour, in her shed for my pick-up on a later date. She was such a thoughtful and helpful person. I am pleased there will be a bench by the library for her remembrance.

The Club membership has increased with 186 household members at the end of December last year compared 164 in 2010. So the Club is growing and its programs for Bowen Island are valued. The regular meetings are well attended and the Open Gardens are a treat for many.

It has been a drastic winter in my garden. A mature choisya (Mexican or mock orange) in the back garden is split vertically through the major trunk. Was it snow or ice or some combination? The leaves are looking very nice at the moment but serious pruning will be required. And I'm sure my agapanthus which survived so nicely last year may not do so again this year. At the same time hardy bulbs (hyacinth, daffodil) are up and the snowdrops are in bud.



My Edgeworthia Chrysanthia is blooming heroically. The flowers are scented. Leaves come later in the season. Apparently the very attractive bark is used in Japan for making paper including bank notes. My shrub is now over 5 feet tall and

grew from a 7 inch starter from Aubin Van Berkels garden.

ON ISLAND OPEN GARDEN TOURS


