ON ISLAND OPEN GARDEN TOURS

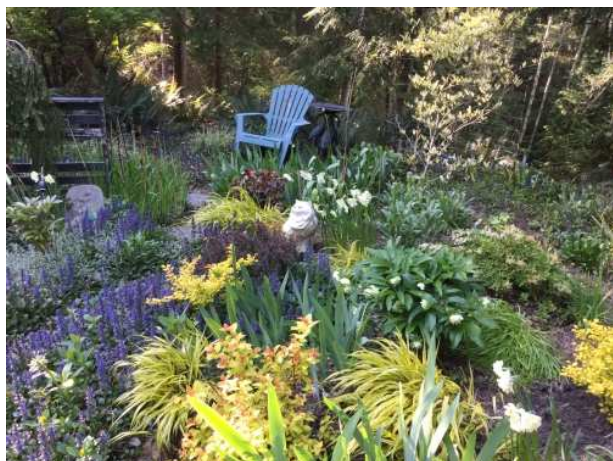
Diane Buchanan– June 14, 2-4pm

From Diane Buchanan:

When I think of my garden I think "old Bowen". In 2001 I returned to the island after a 36 year hiatus. William and I moved to the "Buchanan lands", which we subsequently subdivided so each sibling got a lot. My brothers Michael Buchanan and David Riddell along with John Reid were able to create our lots, a community trail, a park and riparian protection. We felt that this is what our parents would have wanted.

My garden has memories, the old vegetable garden was used by my father, my sister Cathy (David), and my brother Michael (Jane). When we arrived William cleared out the alder, salmon berries and burdock that had moved in. About four years ago I added a new section and last Fall I started another fenced area at the other end of my property.



Most of the yard is not fenced, subsequently lots of deer resistant plants. There is a large field and forested areas. I have a deck area where I grow a lot of "edibles", although the deer have made it up there a couple of times.

Last summer my niece Quinn Buchanan married Jared Brown in the garden. Quinn lived here with her parents Michael and Jane, and with her sisters, Kurstin and Amanda. That was back in the time of the Island Trust. Michael and Jane put a mobile home here hoping our family subdivision would go through. They finally gave up as it was too small a place for their family. That is how William and I inherited this site.

I have made a lot of changes but retained one of my very favourite things, a mural. When Quinn turned ten Jane spearheaded "painting the house" as a birthday activity. It faded over time but 20 years later Quinn with her cousins Holly and Sasha reunited to touch up the painting. This was part of their 30 year celebration.

Winter starts off with the hellebores, lily of the valley, hyacinths, crocus and tiny iris. The magnolia and camellias bloom, bleeding hearts, marsh marigolds and Solomon seal appear. The rhododendrons come into their own along with alliums. On it goes.....the summer has the perennials in the fenced areas and deck. I have approached the deer resistant area in terms of colour and texture. It is a very small homage to Monet's masterpiece garden and an inspiration to my own painting.

As I laid out the various areas I was inspired by my childhood, and how we travelled around the yard. Lots of places to hide and imagine. Every summer we have the Buchanan treasure hunt for the "great kids". This includes the properties of my brothers Patrick (Donna), Christopher (Wolf) and Jane's wooded spot. As the children get older we may make it up the hill to the homes of Tanya and Chris and Cathy and David.

The garden isn't pristine but it is happy and serene and a ongoing learning curve. I am lucky to have Cathy (the vegetable queen) and my good friends Su Rickett and Vicky Anderson to bounce things off of. Please come, I would love to hear any advice or ideas you might bring with you.

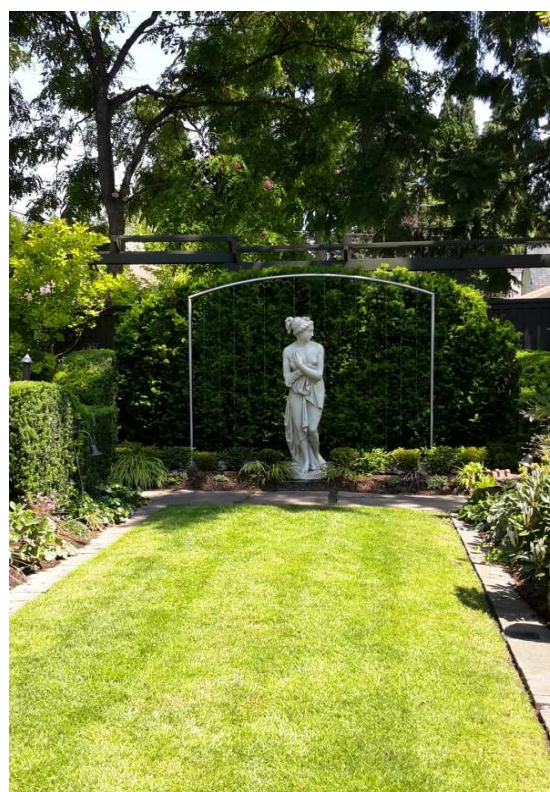
