Landscaping and Gardening Over Septic Fields

On November 16, 2015 the Bowen Island Garden club welcomes two guest speakers, Wynn Nielsen, landscape/garden designer on Bowen Island, and Scott Stevenson, who owns and operates Bowen Island Septic Services. Both Wynn and Scott will bring their respective expertise to this presentation topic of gardening with a septic system, something that presents challenges to many home owners on Bowen Island.

Scott, a registered on-site Waste-water (septic systems) practitioner and fully accredited expert in the installation and repairs of septic systems, will discuss the technology associated with septic systems. He will inform us about the differences between old and new systems, installation, maintenance, recognition and consequences of malfunction. He will also discuss Provincial and Health regulations that govern the installation and maintenance of septic systems.

Wynn, a landscape/garden designer who specializes in naturalistic gardens will focus on the challenges and aesthetics of landscaping and gardening with septic fields.

She will discuss how you can transform a septic field into a landscape asset without compromising the septic field. Although there are challenges and more don'ts than dos Wynn hopes to broaden our knowledge of the potential that exists for us to improve the aesthetics of our septic fields. Yes, they don't have to be a simple piece of lawn! Specific no risk and low risk plants will be identified as safe to use as well as references for us to use in the future. Wynn will also touch on some cautions and limitations of gardening and land use with septic fields (e.g., growing edibles). Also, specific plants that should never be planted near or on a septic field will be identified.

This is a golden opportunity for all Bowen Island newcomers who have never had a septic system to acquaint themselves with both the technology of septic systems and how to garden effectively with them. And for those who are not new to living and gardening with a septic system this is an opportunity to update your knowledge with the technology and perhaps motivate you to re landscape your septic field in a more pleasing way.

Please join us at the Gallery at Artisan Square on Monday Nov 16, 2015 at 1PM. Everyone is welcome. Members no cost and guests only \$ 3.00.

In addition, the Past President and several Directors sit on the Board. The Directors are responsible for: Membership, Speakers, Open Gardens, Tours, Publicity, Hospitality (Social), Technical Services and Editing *Cuttings*, our newsletter.

The following is a very brief summary of the major responsibilities of each position:

Membership: soliciting new members and renewing memberships for those returning; reminding us when our membership fees are due; keeping track of members and their contact information and informing the *Cuttings* editor and Technical Services Director of any changes; as well as any other Board member who may need contact information for a member; attend General Meetings and Open Gardens.

Speakers: seek out potential speakers for our eight General Meetings; contact them to see if arrangements can be made; present ideas to the Board for feedback; prepare and submit for publication information on the speakers and their topics; assist speakers with arrangements for travel to Bowen; introduce speakers at the General Meetings.

Open Gardens: seek out potential Bowen gardens that may be of interest to the members and other Bowen residents; present ideas to the Board for feedback; assist the hosts to prepare for the Open Garden of name tags for members.

Editor *Cuttings*: in addition to compiling, editing and distributing monthly issues of *Cuttings*, the Editor maintains the Club Gmail account, bicuttings@gmail.com, and is responsible for updating both the Club Facebook page: <https://www.facebook.com/bowenislandgardenclub>, and the Club website: www.bowenislandgardenclub.ca.

Tours: seek out gardens and other appropriate locations off Bowen that may be of interest to the members; present ideas to the Board for feedback; make all arrangements for the tour, including travel arrangements, funding, etc.

Publicity: be the contact person for advertising various Garden Club activities that may be of interest to residents at large.

Hospitality (Social): arrange for refreshments at General Meetings, Open Gardens, the Christmas Party and Summer Garden Party, and where necessary, at other Club functions.

Technical Services: this person is a jack of all trades and is responsible for technical assistance for presentations at the General Meetings; for preparation and posting of signs for Club activities, including the Plant Sale and the Open Gardens; preparation .

Should you wish to submit your name for a position President, Vice –President, Secretary, Treasurer or one of the Directors (as above) please feel free to contact any of the Board. The vote will take place at the 2016 January Annual General Meeting.
