PRESIDENT'S RAMBLINGS

What songs go through your mind as you putter in your garden? As I write this a couple of oldies come to my mind: "Spring is busting out all over" and "Oh, what a beautiful morning." We are really blessed, living in such a beautiful spot.

As you probably know, an important part of the Garden Club's mission is Bowen Beautification. Our daffodils and mailbox barrels are part of our on-going beautification efforts, thanks to the efforts and devotion of Past-President Sheila Webster.

A more recent part of that project is our taking on responsibility for the Library garden. Kelley Smith is coordinating that work. Kelley has recommended removing a few plants that have outlived their beauty and she will be putting in some new plants. One of the executive requests was to include native plants as much as possible. The Library garden is one of the few island gardens that gets full sun (none of that in my yard!), and it also has full exposure to deer. Thus the garden needs to have plants that do well in full sun, are reasonably drought tolerant over the summer, and are deer resistant. That poses some serious limitations on what will thrive in that spot. An additional factor we must consider, given the location, is to avoid any plants that might be toxic. Children play in the Library garden!

We have had other requests for support and assistance for a variety of gardens located across the island, and the executive decided it was time to adopt a set of guidelines to assist us in evaluating such requests. After a few months of drafting, discussing, and re-drafting, we think we have a plan! See the final product in this issue of Cuttings on page 6

Another recent initiative is a brochure that outlines our activities and programs and will be distributed in a variety of places on the island. Copies will be available at the upcoming General Meeting. Thanks to executive members Linda, Susan, Virginia and John Hazell, and to Anna-Marie for their contributions to this beautiful brochure.

The garden, as with the house, has grown by whim and design since 1978. It started with the removal of a derelict bathtub that had been left by the previous owner and took a significant step forward in the 90's when Andre Chollat designed the overall structure. It's more recent and ongoing adjustments, nurturing and tweaking have been skillfully and lovingly provided by Kelly Smith.

There are three areas - a rock garden, plantings on a south facing deck and a part shade garden. The three areas are distinct but unified, all variously protected from the deer. The rock garden is self explanatory, tucked in along the edge of a rock promontory on which the deck and part of the house are located. The sunny deck is becoming a vegetable and herb garden. The shade garden is slightly terraced but relatively flat for Bowen. It is characterized by pathways that wind through out-leading around corners and into different 'rooms'. A whimsical feature was the deck and french doors that open up the back of the house to this garden, providing an intimate, shady place to sit and enjoy the various seasons. It also continues the theme of indoor outdoor that characterizes the whole property.....Judith McBride



BOWEN ISLAND GARDEN CLUB BEAUTIFICATION GUIDELINES

Seeking Funding for a Beautification Project?

In keeping with the Club's stated goal of beautification, the Garden Club will support small, short-term beautification projects. It will be necessary to choose projects that satisfy the following guidelines:

1. The project should occur on publicly owned (municipal, provincial or federal) property.
2. The project should be in a central location.
3. A budget should be developed that includes both initial costs and on-going maintenance.

Our resources include:

limited financial support from funds derived from our Annual Plant Sale and Raffle; gardening expertise embracing garden design and knowledge of plants; and short-term physical labour (e.g., a half day), donated by our members.

Please consider your responses to the following questions and submit your request in writing to the Bowen Island Garden Club, Box 271, Bowen Island; or electronically to smhaggerty@shaw.ca.

1. What is the location of your intended project?
2. Has the public owner been approached for approval and through what channel?
3. What funding has been sought from other sources?
4. Do you need help with garden design and/or choice of plants and shrubs?
5. Do you need short-term labour to assist with the preparation of garden beds for planting, or more simply with weeding and general clean-up?
6. Are you requesting financial assistance with the purchase of plants and shrubs? If so, please include an inventory of what you want and cost it out.
7. If the Club provides start-up resources in any of the categories noted above, who will be responsible for long-term garden maintenance?
8. How will the Garden Club be involved in supervision of the project?
