Re: Freedom to Invest in Tomorrow's Workforce Act (H.R. 1477)

Dear Representatives Spanberger and Wittman:

The American Institute of CPAs (AICPA) supports the bipartisan legislation, H.R. 1477, the Freedom to Invest in Tomorrow's Workforce Act. This bill will provide accounting professionals with greater financial flexibility as they enter the workforce and seek to further their education.

H.R. 1477 would expand eligible uses of 529 savings plans to include fees and expenses required to obtain or maintain recognized postsecondary credentials, including professional credentials and certifications. It is our understanding that this bill would allow individuals to use 529 funds for expenses, fees, and costs related to the Uniform CPA Examination (CPA Exam), which is one of three critical components required for licensure as a certified public accountant (CPA) in the United States.

As this legislation advances, we would emphasize the importance of ensuring that 529 plan owners and administrators can easily understand and use the expanded benefit. To help achieve this outcome, we encourage increased clarity around the process used to identify a certification as a "recognized postsecondary credential," as well as clarity on the qualifying expenses, fees, and costs under the proposal.
