If you have been away from the cathedral for a while, welcome home. If you are new to the cathedral, welcome. If you are just passing through, we're so glad you did. If you've been here all along, thanks be to God!

Autumn on Long Island is a season in which the swift passage of time and the fleeting nature of our mortal lives is brought into focus by the natural world and the pace of activity. As the leaves change and fall - as school and programs start up again - as temperatures drop and summer becomes a distant memory, our bodies and souls yearn for connection and warmth. Memories of autumns past; of beginnings, endings, and new beginnings enter our consciousness.

The cathedral stands as a sacred touchstone in the midst of this season of change. It endures as a custodian of memory, transformation, and inspired beginnings. With its pinnacles reaching heavenward, the cathedral proclaims the faith of the ages in the midst of time: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

We will be visited this autumn by inspiring speakers, musicians, preachers and teachers. Members of the cathedral clergy and staff will be launching new programs to deepen our faith in the future supported by exceptional volunteers. It will be a rich season for us to worship, connect, grow and serve together in this community of care.

I hope you are inspired by the images and the messages in this newsletter to partake fully in our common life. As the seasons change and we look toward the future together, I am so glad to share this journey of faith with you.

Worship Schedule

SUNDAY SERVICE SCHEDULE

8:00AM Traditional Mass

The 8:00 service is a Said Mass, using traditional language.

9:15AM Cathedral for Kids

A service for the young—and the young at heart! This Mass includes interactive music, traditional hymns, scripture, storytelling, and communion. The service will be engaging for smaller children and adults alike and will offer teaching on themes that connect our prayer life to spiritual and social learning.

11:15AM Choral Mass

The 11:15 Choral Mass is a full cathedral service featuring choral music. The preaching relates the scriptures of the day to our daily lives, and the music is carefully chosen to relate to the themes of the season.

4:00AM Choral Evensong

(usually the first Sunday of the month; check incarnationgc.org/music for dates)

Choral Evensong has been in use in the Anglican Church for centuries. The service consists of prayers, scripture, hymns and texts sung by the choir.

A Red Mass is a special service in which we pray for judges, lawyers, law school professors, law students, government officials, and all those who work for justice. The Rev. Marie Tatro, Vicar for Community Justice in The Episcopal Diocese of Long Island, will preach. All are welcome.



All Hallow's Eve Liturgy and Tour

October 31st, half hour timed tickets available between 6:30pm and 9pm

On this All Hallows' Eve, you are invited to walk the bridge between the living and the dead as we journey together to the Cathedral Crypt to honor the souls of Garden City's founders, who were buried there over a century ago. Follow burning lanterns as we walk the cathedral's sacred grounds, hear ghost stories, honor our faithful ancestors, and perhaps find out once-and-for-all if the Cathedral of the Incarnation is haunted.

The program is appropriate for families and people of all ages. Be prepared for fire, smoke, loud noises, apparitions and prayers by candlelight. Following the program, be sure to "trick-or-treat" at See House, the historic mansion of the bishops of Long Island since 1880.

Presiding Bishop of The Episcopal Church, the Most Rev. Michael B. Curry Preaches this November

The Presiding Bishop will be preaching at the cathedral on November 18th for one service only in celebration of the 150th anniversary of the Diocese of Long Island.

Presiding Bishop Curry maintains a national preaching and teaching ministry, having been featured on The Protestant Hour and as a frequent speaker at churches, cathedrals, and conferences around the country and internationally. Most famously, he preached at the royal wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle this year.

He has authored three books: *Following the Way of Jesus: Church's Teachings in a Changing World* (2017); *Songs My Grandma Sang* (2015); and *Crazy Christians: A Call to Follow Jesus* (2013). He was one of the subjects of *In Conversation: Michael Curry and Barbara Harris* by Fredrica Harris Thompsett (2017).

As a new choir season begins, we wish to highlight a wonderful new opportunity for children, the Junior Choristers. This group of younger singers will rehearse weekly, on Tuesdays from 6:30-8:00pm, and will sing twice a month at the 9:15am Cathedral for Kids Mass, joined by some of the older choristers. After Mass, they will go off to their Church School classes at Fellowship in Faith in the Mercer School.

The Junior Choristers will learn sight-singing, music-reading, and healthy singing technique in a fun, gentle, low key, no stress atmosphere allowing each child to progress at their own pace. This is a wonderful way for your child to meet new friends in a safe, caring environment, have a lot of fun, and to learn something new that will stay with them for life.

“How do I become a member of the Cathedral?” is a question that we quite often hear. My response has always been, “Well, you just need to come to church on a regular basis.” But it is certainly more than that. It’s about discerning

whether the cathedral is the right fit for you and your family. Which style of liturgy most appeals to you: Do you prefer a ‘said’ Mass using the traditional Old English language of the Church? Are you looking for a Mass focusing on the young and the young at heart? Or are you taken deep into prayer at our Choral Mass? Are you looking for a church where you can raise questions about life, faith and how they intersect with the world?

The cathedral is a very diverse community of people of “all sorts and conditions” (BCP p. 814) where everyone is not only welcomed but embraced.

One of the ways that you are invited into that embrace is through a process called the “Catechumenate”, a series of opportunities to question life, spirituality, faith, the Bible, God and the Church. Participation in the Catechumenate can lead to the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation or being formally received into The Episcopal Church. It can also be a way to reaffirm and renew your life of faith as an Episcopalian.

So “how do you become a member of the Episcopal Church?” Begin the Catechumenate process by joining our Discovery Class at Fellowship in Faith on November 25th.
