Sydney Airport has implemented a range of strategies to target and reduce unlawful interference with aviation.

CCTV forms only one part of an integrated approach to security and safety at the airport. Sydney Airport encourages effective aviation security by facilitating stakeholder participation and consultation.



Purpose of CCTV

CCTV significantly increases the ability to monitor areas of the airport and aims to do the following:

- assist in the prevention and detection of acts of unlawful interference against aviation
- reduce acts of unlawful interference with aviation by deterring potential offenders through fear of detection
- assist government and law enforcement agencies with the detection and identification of offenders
- to aid in a more effective assessment and response to unlawful acts of interference including security, safety and emergency situations.

All footage captured by CCTV is retained by Sydney Airport for a time period recommended by the Australian Standard, industry practice and having regard to IT storage constraints.

Sydney Airport has a 24 hour Operations Centre where CCTV is monitored by specially trained security officers. Sydney Airport will only release CCTV footage to law enforcement bodies for law enforcement purposes or to comply with a subpoena. Sydney Airport may at its discretion show CCTV footage airport stakeholders to assist in providing a safe and secure environment and to assist in the efficient operation of the airport. For the purposes of illustration only, it is probable that Sydney Airport would exercise its discretion to allow access to CCTV footage to airlines where a genuine and legitimate safety or security concern is raised. Sydney Airport, however is very unlikely to exercise its discretion to allow access to CCTV footage where a genuine and legitimate safety or security concern is not raised.

Access by members of the public to Sydney Airport owned and operated CCTV footage can only occur if a subpoena has been issued by a court of law requesting from Sydney Airport specific CCTV footage. Any such subpoena should be issued promptly after an incident as Sydney Airport does not indefinitely hold such footage (refer above).
