WELCOME TO Singita Mara River Tented Camp

Overlooking a spectacular riverbend in the northernmost corner of the Serengeti, the camp is located in the Lamai Triangle – close to awe-inspiring wildebeest crossings during the Great Migration.

Fitting seamlessly into its magnificent natural surrounds, Mara's six suites cater to every modern need and whim – featuring utilitarian, lightweight and modular elements as well as clean, curved lines in spacious tented sanctuaries; and exude contemporary luxury while being light-filled, functional, and fresh.

In the main lodge area, the pool sala invites al fresco dining, while a signature bar-deli provides fresh and healthy snacks for guests to help themselves whenever they want. Embracing new African flavours, Mara's food journey emphasises dishes that contain locally sourced, seasonal ingredients, while offering a taste of East African culinary traditions.

The camp is set in 98,000 acres of untouched wilderness in northern Tanzania. Inspiring intrepid explorers to make the most of their time in this coveted wilderness, each stay encompasses access to some of the world's most prized and private game-viewing opportunities.

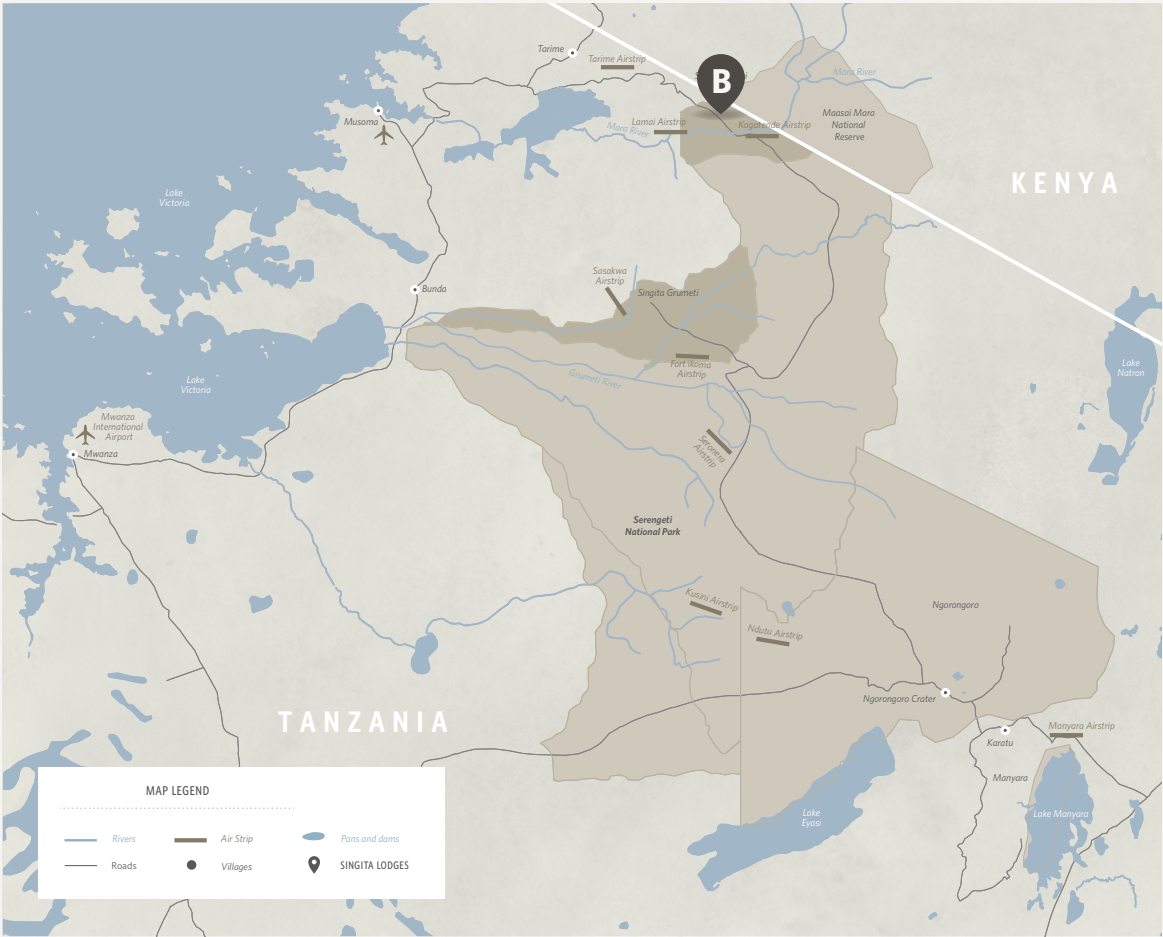


LOCATION OF LAMAI TRIANGLE [A]

Spanning over 98,000 acres of untouched wilderness, Singita Lamai is located in northern Tanzania, bordering the Maasai Mara National Reserve. Singita Mara River Tented Camp is ideally positioned on the renowned migratory route traversed annually by more than a million wildebeest.

Singita Mara River Tented Camp consciously seeks to eliminate the unnecessary use of energy and nonbiodegradable materials. In keeping with this, the camp is “off-the-grid” and relies entirely on a custom-designed solar power system and uses recycled and natural materials.

IN THE COMFORT OF THE LODGE

- Singita Mara River Tented Camp offers a plunge pool at the main camp area, the perfect place for a relaxing dip under the vast African sky.
- With a range of Wholeness experiences seamlessly woven into every stay, guests can ease into everything from wellness treatments to yoga or meditation while soaking up the privacy of their suites or private decks.
- Wine tastings: Singita's experienced sommeliers can guide guests through a variety of wine styles, years and cultivars to find the wines most suited to their tastes and preferences.
- Stargazing is a major highlight – contemplate the magnificent African night skies.
- Children's activities offered at the lodge include cooking interactions, board games and activity booklets loaded with games, quizzes and puzzles.

- Journeying into the heart of Africa's most untouched and remote wilderness areas, Singita's twice-daily game drives present the opportunity for intimate connections with nature and discovering the raw beauty of the continent's most magnificent creatures up close.

AMENITIES

- There is complimentary internet (WiFi) access; however due to the remote location of the lodge, the wireless connection can be slow and intermittent.
- Electricity/power available: The camp is off-grid, powered by solar energy with backup generators. International plug points are available.
- There is no television at this camp – an opportunity to truly “switch off” and enjoy being in nature.
- Children aged ten and over are welcome. There are babysitting services available and tailor-made activities to suit each family.
- Children’s participation in game activities is at the discretion of your guide.
- Dietary needs or restrictions are fully catered and Halaal meals are available. Please book in advance.



Preparing for your journey

BE GUIDED BY THE WEATHER:

OCTOBER - APRIL:

Casual summer clothing (shorts and lightweight shirts) with a warm jersey or sweater for the cooler morning and evening temperatures.

MAY - SEPTEMBER:

Casual lightweight clothing with a warm parka or windbreaker jacket for the very cold mornings and nights.

PACKING TIPS TO ENSURE A COMFORTABLE SAFARI EXPERIENCE:

- Natural, lightweight fabrics in neutral colours (green, khaki and grey) are recommended for walking safaris and game drives in order to blend in to the landscape and remain inconspicuous to wildlife.
- Layering items of clothing is recommended to navigate the fluctuations in temperature between the cool early mornings and evenings and midday heat.
- No formal wear is required at our lodges.
- Waterproof ponchos are provided in the case of rain.
- Comfortable walking or track shoes, or hiking boots are advised for walks, with sandals sufficient for wear around the lodge.
- Bring a bathing suit, sunhat, sunglasses and sunblock.
- Mosquito repellent.
- Camera, video camera, chargers, and additional memory cards (binoculars are provided in the suites).

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Please consult your doctor or physician before travelling.

Singita Mara River Tented Camp is situated in a malaria-risk area. It is therefore essential that you consult your medical practitioner regarding anti-malaria requirements prior to your trip.

Vaccinations: Guests are strongly advised to check the latest information with regard to vaccinations for travel to Tanzania with their local travel clinic or travel agent.

Weather and climate

BEST TIME TO GO ON SAFARI

East Africa is equatorial, so the climate is fairly constant, making Singita Lamai a perfect year-round destination.

The Green Season, from November to May, offers long, warm days with short downpours of rain transforming the landscape to a lush green teeming with diverse wildlife. From June to October is traditionally the migration season and days are warm, sunny and dry.

The journey

BY AIR

Scheduled flights or air charters can be arranged for your trip.

- All flights land at Serengeti Lamai airstrip. On arrival, guests are met by a Singita staff member and driven to Mara River Tented Camp (45 min).
- On scheduled flights, the luggage weight is restricted to 15kg (33lb) for checked baggage. Only soft-sided luggage is permitted.
- Kilimanjaro – Singita: approximately 1 hr 45 minutes (via Sasakwa airstrip)
- Arusha – Singita: approximately 1 hr 30 minutes (via Sasakwa airstrip).

- Transport to and from Singita Grumeti or Singita Lamai

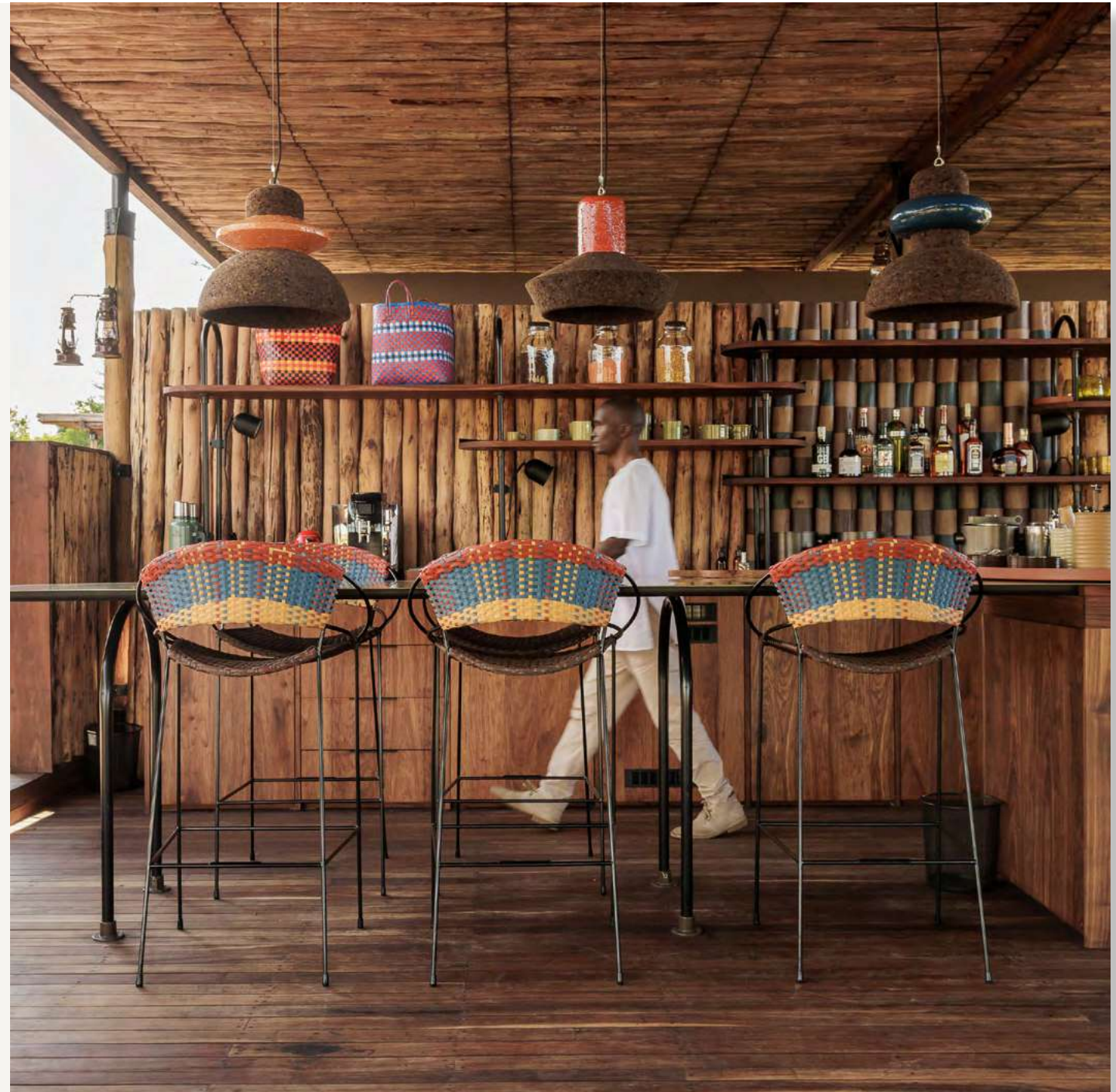
CHECK-IN/CHECK-OUT TIMES AND LODGE CLOSURE
