# proposed workshop program outline;

to be conducted at all weekly plantings throughout the next 12 months

#### detailed activities;

template checklist interviewing regular members (old & new) interviewing guest volunteers, taking photos, highlighting displays with project details, mapping activities, special education awareness days (onsite plantings, school forums, market days, environmental expos) video segments of ephemeral art installations, sound recordings, members drawings, photo comps, poetry, music, species identification, seed collection, propagation, weeding, site selection and place appraisals.

project culminates at a 'projection' night ... eg; National Tree Day, Brisbane Festival

## artists and facilitators;

apart from our existing members who are artists in various media we also incorporate 'invited' artists, celebrities. Our next meeting, via eletter & eblog, we select a sub committee to appoint facilitators, grant writers, researchers, interviewers media & grant spokesperson and production crew to achieve this vision mandate.

#### workshop durations;

held at the conclusion of each planting each week for around 30 minutes - longer timeframes for our public workshops

## essential equipment;

armature materials, papers & fibres, non toxic paints, existing cutting tools, existing photographic & recording equipment, existing publishing programs and projectionist hire equipment

#### space requirements;

utilising open public space & domestic production space

sound / photography / drawing / installation with digital documentation for publication and projection purposes
