On matchdays, Here to Help staff, easily identified by their pink uniforms, are on hand to assist you. They can direct you to various areas of King Power Stadium, as well as provide external directions, including Leicester train & bus stations.

A Safe & Inclusive Environment



The Club celebrates diversity and works to create an experience on matchdays and non-matchdays that is safe and enjoyable for all. The Club welcomes all to King Power Stadium, regardless of age, disability, gender, race, faith, sexual orientation or any other protected characteristic.

The Club continues to work with The FA, Premier League, EFL and other key stakeholders across the game to tackle anti-social and criminal behaviours within football grounds, and to underline the importance of a safe matchday environment.

All supporters and staff must be treated fairly and with respect.

The Club condemns, and does not tolerate, any form of discriminatory, abusive, and/or anti-social conduct or behaviour at King Power Stadium and any other football stadium. If the Club finds any supporter committing any of the prohibited offences or behaviours at, around or on the journey to/from King Power Stadium, any other Club premises or any other football stadium, or via online media or any other media, the Club shall be entitled to impose such sanctions on the supporter as it considers appropriate in the circumstances, which may include (by way of example) match bans, a lifetime ban from all Club fixtures, the withdrawal of tickets and/or memberships, without reimbursement, and/or the removal of any Club benefits (including priority points). In addition, such supporter could face arrest and prosecution by the police.

Supporters are reminded that the King Power Stadium Ground Regulations and any applicable Supporter Code of Conduct, must be adhered to at all times.

Where applicable, Club sanctions will be issued in accordance with the Club's Sanctions and Appeals process, taking into account applicable policies and guidance (including the Premier League Commitment regarding Discriminatory and Abusive Conduct).

SOCIAL MEDIA SANCTIONS POLICY

LCFC's Social Media Banning Policy, which can be found on the Club's website at LCFC.com/pages/en/help-sanctions-appeals-guidance, states that any individuals or groups observed to be making discriminatory or abusive comments on Leicester City Football Club's official social media channels should be banned using each social network's reporting/banning mechanism.

Any online conduct deemed to be a "Prohibited Activity" under the Premier League Commitment will be dealt with in accordance with the agreed process set out in section C of the PL Commitment.

Leicester City is a family club and is connected online with supporters of all ages from a wide variety of backgrounds. As such, the Club's social media accounts should harbour an environment and community that is welcoming and free of inappropriate messages/behaviour.

The Club's Content Department regularly monitor posts for such behaviour and other online users may report incidents of online abuse to the Club. The remit of the Club's Sanctions Committee extends to all forms of abuse and/or inappropriate behaviour and so supporters found to be committing online offences may be subject to Club sanctions.

Sanctions are imposed for, but not limited to, swearing, threatening messages, any post that discriminates against protected characteristics and other behaviour that the Club deems inappropriate on its channels. This includes, but is not limited to, general spam and the posting of links to illegal match streams.

Social networks include, but are not limited to: Facebook, X (Twitter), YouTube, Instagram, Threads, LinkedIn and TikTok.

All decisions to ban or block accounts from LCFC media channels are made at the Content Department's discretion.

LCFC does not tolerate online abuse in any form and if you are a Season Ticket Holder, Member, or match by match purchaser of tickets to Club fixtures conducting such abuse, you will be referred to the Club's Sanctions Committee who will consider whether to issue a sanction to you in respect of your online activity.

If you use online abuse on non-LCFC media channels towards the Club, our players, or staff, you will be reported to the social network company and if you are a Season Ticket Holder, Member, or match by match purchaser of tickets to Club fixtures, you will be referred to the Club's Sanctions Committee who will consider whether to issue a sanction to you in respect of your online activity.

Depending on the severity and nature of your conduct/offence, the Club's Sanctions Committee may review the conduct/offence and issue sanctions as it sees fit.

The sanction may include (without limitation) a written warning, match bans, the removal of priority points, a seasonal ban and/or a lifetime ban.

Second offences will automatically carry a lengthier ban.

APPEALS PROCESS

If you have been issued with a Club sanction and wish to appeal such sanction, you must lodge your appeal to the Club's Board Office. This can be done either by sending a signed letter addressed to Board Office, Leicester City Football Club, King Power Stadium, Filbert Way, Leicester LE2 7FL or by emailing boardoffice@lcfc. co.uk, stating the reason for your appeal and providing any supporting evidence, within seven days of the date of the letter confirming your sanction.

Your appeal will be brought before the Club's Appeals Committee (separate to the Sanctions Committee) as soon as is reasonably possible, and you will be advised of the outcome of your appeal within 14 days of a decision being made.

Supporters With Disabilities



LCFC are committed to providing services and facilities for supporters with disabilities. On matchday, there is a dedicated stewarding team to help these supporters make the most out of the matchday experience.

If you have any queries prior to your trip, or on matchday, please contact the Club's Disability Liaison Officer Anna Dickman by emailing **disability@lcfc.co.uk** or calling **0116 229 4540**.

The Visitors Section, accessible by wheelchair users from turnstiles 42-43, houses accessible toilets 25 metres from designated seating. All accessible toilets require RADAR keys, which can be obtained from stewards. All accessible toilets have a dropdown rail and an emergency alarm.

Other facilities available for supporters with disabilities include:

Audio Descriptive Service: Designed for supporters with visual impairments, a specially trained team provides an account of all the matchday action. This service is free* to use for supporters, who can listen to the action through headsets available from the matchday staff entrance an hour and a half before kick-off. Headsets should be returned to the same location after the match.

*Failure to return the headset will incur an £80 fee – with deposit details taken on collection of the headset.

Hearing Loops: Hearing loops are fitted and clearly signed at various locations around King Power Stadium including the ticket office, Foxes Fanstore, main reception and catering outlets.

Catering: Available in every stand throughout King Power Stadium, with low level access provided to all food counters (between 77cm – 109cm in height).

Accessible Toilets:

- The accessible toilet is 25m (27yd 1ft) from the nearest designated seating, located along the East Stand concourse next to the pitchside entrance V41
- A RADAR key is required for the accessible toilet, which can be obtained from a steward
- The width of the accessible toilet door is 2ft 10in
- The dimensions of the accessible toilet are 5ft 3in x 9ft 6in
- There is a dropdown rail on the transfer side and an emergency alarm in the cubicle
- The accessible toilet is 25m from the nearest designated seating, and is located along the Visitors Section concourse
- A RADAR key is required for the accessible toilet, which can be obtained from a steward
- The width of the accessible toilet door is 2ft 10in
- The dimensions of the accessible toilet are 5ft 1in x 7ft 5in
- There is a dropdown rail on the transfer side and an emergency alarm in the cubicle

Car Parking: Visiting supporters with disabilities can purchase car park spaces for £11 per car from their respective club, before the day of the game.

Train

Leicester Train Station is roughly 1.2 miles from King Power Stadium. This equates to an approximate five-minute car journey or up to a 45-minute walk.

To walk from Leicester Train Station, exit the station, cross London Road at the traffic lights, turn left and follow the road to King Power Stadium around to the right. Keep the Central Ring Road (Waterloo Way) on your left as the path separates from the road, staying on this path as it crosses New Walk. The path then re-joins the pavement, at which point Nelson Mandela Park will be in view. Turn right onto Lancaster Road and walk through the park, heading for the crossings by the public toilets. Cross Welford Road and turn left, following the road around – passing Morrisons supermarket – to King Power Stadium.

Car

The M1 and M69 Motorways interchange at Junction 21 (M1), where you should exit and follow the signs for the City Centre via the A5460.

After three miles, turn right onto Upperton Road, follow the road down until you get to the Liberty Statue Island and take the fifth exit down Western Boulevard. You will then see King Power Stadium on your right-hand side.

Bus


Several bus services run from Leicester city centre to King Power Stadium, stopping on Aylestone Road, which is a five-minute walk from King Power Stadium.

Most buses in Leicester are low floor vehicles, meaning they can be lowered to pavement level once the bus has stopped. Buses all include wheelchair spaces. For details on routes to Leicester, visit www.travelineeastmidlands.co.uk.




Park & Ride

On foot

Please note: When walking around the local area on a matchday, please do not deviate from the pedestrian footpaths and avoid walking in the road, even if the pavement appears congested. This is particularly important on Aylestone Road and Narborough Road with the number of fast-moving vehicles passing.

Details of known road closures throughout the season will be communicated via the Club's communications channels at the earliest opportunity.

Cycle Park

Leicester City are proud to promote all forms of green travel. As such, the Club encourages local supporters to utilise the cycle park by cycling to King Power Stadium.

For those local to Leicester, cycling offers an attractive alternative, helping minimise the impact of matchday traffic.

Supporters travelling to King Power Stadium on bike can use the cycle park, free of charge. The facility offers 20 spaces on a first come, first served basis. Cyclists should enter via Car Park B and show their match ticket on arrival.

Car Parking

For supporters driving to King Power Stadium, parking can be purchased prior to the day of the match for £19 per car on the Club's Filbert Street car park. To book, please call the City Sales Centre on **0344 815 5000 (Option 1)**.

There are also several independent car parks in the area surrounding King Power Stadium. These facilities generally cost £4/£5 per car. The car parks are situated around Freemans Common and Leicester Tigers Rugby Stadium which is around a 10-minute walk from King Power Stadium.

Visiting supporters are accommodated in the corner of the North and East stands – all seats have unrestricted views.

These supporters can access their area through turnstiles 40 to 49 (dependant on ticket allocation) up to 90 minutes before kick-off. The accessible entrance is at turnstiles 42 to 43.


