Passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II was the constitutional monarch of our country since 1952. Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II visited our country and our city on many occasions and has even travelled past our RSL. Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II will be sadly missed across the world and we offer her eternal peace.

Therefore, following the announcement by the Governor-General of Australia on the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and in accordance with protocol, the Australian National Flag and other official flags should be flown at half-mast as a mark of mourning and respect.

Our flag will be flown at half-mast as soon as practical today being Friday September 9 until notified further.

It is customary to fly the flag at half-mast from the time of announcement of the death of The Sovereign until the day after the funeral. An acceptable half-mast position would be when the top of the flag is a third of the distance down from the top of the flagpole.

All flags, should be flown at half-mast during daylight hours. Flags may be flown during the night provided they are illuminated. If there is no illumination, flags must not be at half-mast during the night, and should be lowered at dusk and raised at dawn.
