

DEUTERONOMY 6:1-12

Now this is the commandment—the statutes and the ordinances—that the Lord your God charged me to teach you to observe in the land that you are about to cross into and occupy, so that you and your children and your children's children may fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and keep all his decrees and his commandments that I am commanding you, so that your days may be long. Hear therefore, O Israel, and observe them diligently, so that it may go well with you and so that you may multiply greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, as the Lord, the God of your ancestors, has promised you.

Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

When the Lord your God has brought you into the land that he swore to your ancestors, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give you—a land with fine, large cities that you did not build, houses filled with all sorts of goods that you did not fill, hewn cisterns that you did not hew, vineyards and olive groves that you did not plant—and when you have eaten your fill, take care that you do not forget the Lord, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.



THE GOSPEL MARK 12:28-34

THE INDUCTION

Others present Oil of the Sick, saying

George, use this oil, and be among us as a healer and reconciler.

The Wardens presents the keys of the church, saying

George, receive these keys, and let the doors of this place be open to all people.

People Amen

Representative clergy of the diocese present the Constitution and Canons of this Church, saying

George, obey these Canons, and be among us to share in the councils of this diocese.

Other Representatives of the congregation present bread and wine, saying George, take this bread and wine, and be among us to break the Bread and bless the Cup.

The Bishop then says

George, let all these be signs of the ministry which is mine and yours in this place.

Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do. Make me an instrument of your salvation for the people entrusted to my care, and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments, and by my life and teaching set forth your true and living Word. Be always with me in carrying out the duties of my ministry. In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; in preaching, give me readiness of thought and expression; and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world

may be drawn into your blessed kingdom.	All this I ask for the sake of your
Son our Savior Jesus Christ.







In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.
