The longing deep within humans for a life of peaceful harmony and tranquility within our spirit, families, communities and world is nothing less than God's longing. I have heard the spirit and longing in many of you over the past year to find a way to be of assistance to others during this terrible period in world history. If Covid has anything to teach us, it teaches that if we do not listen for the voice of the Spirit that calls us out of the building and into the wider community, we are ill prepared for the deeper life God wants for us and for which we long.

Perhaps some are rethinking what it means to be church. Some may even be saying church is not what I thought it to be and some saying I don't like what church has become. No matter where you are on the continuum, I celebrate the fact that you are on the continuum asking and engaging the question of the purpose of the church. It is a fearful question and not made any easier by the chances and changes of life.

The secret of a vital (missional – joining Jesus in the wider community and do as we see him and the Father at work in the world), and viable (beyond surviving but Thriving) faith community consists in a community's groundedness in 4 things: prayer, Eucharist, loving community and attentiveness to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. As Lesslie Newbigin, a missionary and theologian noted, Jesus did not leave a body of writing; he left a community.

Last advent as a way of getting to know you, be a teacher as well as pastor among you, I offered a series about Annunciations, Dreams and discerning the activity of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the people around Jesus, in our own lives and corporate life of Trinity. Through this and weekly bible study, preaching on Sunday and antiracism discussion group despite the limitations of Covid, we continue to get to know one another and listen and look for the call and leading of the Holy Spirit to infuse and animate Trinity for mission in the community. This advent I have invited The Very Rev. Denis Brunelle, The Rev. Christina van Liew and The Rt. Rev. Lawrence Provenzano to focus on the Incarnation of Jesus and the activity of the Holy Spirit. I hope everyone will take part in these presentations and allow the Spirit to soak in and inspire. It is my prayer that this series will prepare this congregation and its leadership for the work of discernment ahead in the next months.

Warden's Letter – December 2020

As of this writing, COVID-19 is spiking all over the country, and everyone is preparing for a Thanksgiving considerably different from previous years. The circumstances are different, but the giving thanks remains the same. I am always thankful for our Trinity family. Meanwhile, the work of the church goes on:

- The first in-person service since March was held on September 13. Following all the Diocesan requirements for safe worship, those who attended wore masks, kept social distance, hand sanitized, and left immediately after the 30-minute service, but it was good to be back home in our beautiful sanctuary again. We are grateful to Mike for all his work to sanitize the church for our safety. In-person services have been held about every other week, but Zoom services are always available each Sunday. All in-person services will be subject to cancellation if the rate of infection in our area reaches an unsafe level.
- The Child Care Center reopened in September in complete compliance with all the State and Diocesan requirements. We operated at about 50% capacity to start with, but more students have gradually been added as time went on.
- Roslyn Trinity Day School also reopened in September to about 50% capacity. We have granted them a rent reduction until they can bring their enrollment back up.
- The church has long needed an upgrade in its technical capacity so that concerts and other events can be held with maximum

visual and aural effects. Plus, with so many services held via Zoom, we needed to improve the quality of the broadcasts. The estimate for doing the necessary upgrades was \$13,000. In October we received a \$5,000 grant from the Diocese towards the project, and generous parishioners donated the remaining \$8,000, so we will at last be able to accomplish this important work. Once all the equipment is purchased and installed, in addition to more efficient Zoom services, we will be able to schedule the first in what we plan will be a regular lecture series.

- Work has been completed on the retaining wall directly behind the church, which had been in disrepair for quite some time.
- The sale of the rectory closed on October 20. The proceeds will be held in trust by the Diocese for whenever the time comes for Trinity to acquire a new rectory.

And now we look forward to Advent, the season of anticipation, the season of hope. At this dark time, may we let the Love that came down at Christmas fill our hearts once again.

The next Burning Books selection is *On the Road*, Jack Kerouac's classic picaresque novel, based on his adventures across the country with Neal Cassady (a.k.a. Dean Moriarty) and other friends. We'll meet via Zoom on Tuesday, December 1, at 7:30 p.m.

We'll kick off 2021 with a couple of #1 New York Times bestsellers: *Being Mortal* by Atul Gawande and *When Breath Becomes Air* by Paul Kalanithi, both written by surgeons. Gawande addresses the inescapable realities of aging and death through research and gripping stories. In Kalinithi's case, the story is his own, as he faces stage IV lung cancer and asks, "What makes life worth living in the face of death?"

Gawande himself commented, "Rattling, heartbreaking, and ultimately beautiful, the too-young Dr. Kalanithi's memoir is proof that the dying are the ones who have the most to teach us about life." Although we feared that this "mortal combo" might be hugely depressing as the world copes with COVID-19, we concluded that the books' humanity would ultimately be life-affirming.
