RURAL & MIGRANT UPDATES

Reflecting on 8 days, 1,000 miles and 50 stops in Honor of Immigrant Workers...

What a powerful thing it is to bear witness. What strength there is when we do it in numbers.

From August 2-9, Rural & Migrant Ministry led a statewide caravan - Save New York's Rural Economy: A Journey of Empathy - to foster an appreciation of immigrants by holding up their humanity and emphasizing their essential contributions to New York's rural economy and agriculture. Our goal, to change the narrative surrounding immigration and to deliver a message of love to policymakers caught in the vitriol of denying the humanity of immigrants - and in turn, destroying our communities, damaging our economy and threatening our collective wellbeing. Along the way we encountered righteous people and heard stories of humanity that we will never forget.

Throughout the week, nearly 2,000 people joined the core group of 15 RMM staff, volunteers and allies. From Eastern Long Island to Lake Erie, the group traveled through countless communities, from the South Fork of Long Island to the Hudson Valley, the Capital District in the North Country along the Canadian Border and finally in Buffalo. The group supported local businesses, held vigils at farms and farmers markets, historically significant locations such as the Harriet Tubman Home, Frederick Douglas Burial Site, Fort Ontario Refugee Shelter and the Women's Rights National Historical Park, in addition to churches and synagogues, Congress member's offices, courthouses and colleges, parks and nursing homes, state welcome centers, child care centers and federal detention centers.



GO FUND ME CAMPAIGN FOR WHEELCHAIR VAN

Mark and I are finally purchasing a wheelchair accessible van to have the freedom and flexibility of going anywhere we would like to go together. It has been challenging as we have been working on setting aside personal funds to make a sizable down payment as well as working with our building management to create ADA compliant parking spaces as there were no compliant parking spaces in our building last year when we requested reasonable accommodations. We have been working with the lawyer representing our building management since January, and the building converted 6 parking spaces into 4 ADA compliant spaces, the first one going to us.

A new wheelchair-accessible van can cost between \$70,000 - \$100,000. These vehicles are specialty vehicles custom made to fit the lifestyle and needs of the individual with the disability. The conversion and customizing can cost between \$25,000-\$40,000 above the baseline cost of a mini-van, therefore costing much more for this vehicle than for a regular vehicle that any able-bodied individual would purchase for their transportation needs.



We are hoping with this fundraiser to close the gap between what we are using of our own money to fund the van and financing monthly payments. Your generosity would bring our dreams into reality, allowing us more freedom to enjoy life and visit our family, friends and loved ones throughout the Tri-State area. We hope you would donate any amount that you are able to and help us realize our

goal. Mark is looking forward to coming to Trinity on a regular basis!
