

Assistive technology for physical and motor impairments (iOS)

Assistive technology enhances productivity and convenience by making daily tasks easier and more efficient. This tip sheet highlights some of the common built-in accessibility features on Apple (iOS) devices that may be useful for individuals living with physical and motor impairments.



Tip: Before you get started, familiarize yourself with how to locate and open the Settings app on your device. It's a pre-installed app and typically has a gear icon.

Controlling your smart home

Controlling your smart home through your mobile device offers a transformative experience for individuals living with physical and motor impairments. Smart home technology allows users to more easily manage their living environment - including lighting, temperature, security and entertainment systems - with simple taps and gestures on their mobile device.

How to control your smart home

Set up smart home devices: Ensure that your smart home devices are compatible with iOS and have been properly set up and connected to your home network. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for each device.



Install smart home apps: Install the respective apps for your smart home devices from the App Store. These apps allow you to control and manage your devices from your iOS device.

Connect devices to the app: Open each smart home app and follow the instructions to connect and pair your devices with the app. This typically involves connecting to your home Wi-Fi network and following the on-screen prompts.

TELUS Wise tips

- Manage permission and privacy settings: Some apps and social networking sites allow its developers to access your personal information like your contact list, location or photos. Read and update permission and privacy settings to control how your information is used and who is able to see it.
- Protect your network: Keep smart home devices on a separate "guest" Wi-Fi network, protecting your personal network in the event of a hack.

Create scenes and automations: Use the smart home app to create scenes and automations. Scenes allow you to control multiple devices such as lighting and temperature, simultaneously with a single command, while automations enable devices to respond automatically based on triggers or schedules. For instance, a light can turn on when you enter a room.

Use voice control: If your smart home devices support voice control, you can use Siri on iOS to control them. Ensure that your devices are compatible with Apple's HomeKit platform and follow the manufacturer's instructions to set up voice control.



Control devices from Control Center: You can access the Control Center by swiping down from the top-right corner of the screen (or up from the bottom on older devices). In the Control Center, you'll find shortcuts to control your smart home devices, such as lights, thermostats and locks.



Use the Home app: iOS also provides a built-in Home app that allows you to control and manage your smart home devices in one place. Open the Home app to view and control your devices, create scenes and adjust settings.



Using Switch Control

Switch Control is a powerful accessibility feature on your device; it transforms the way individuals living with physical and motor impairments interact with their devices. By enabling Switch Control, users can navigate and control their device using external adaptive switches or the device's touchscreen. The customizable and intuitive interface enables users to interact with their device in a way that suits their abilities and preferences.

How to use Switch Control

- Open the Settings app
- Tap on Accessibility
- Tap on Switch Control
- Toggle the switch next to Switch Control to enable it

Connect external switches: Connect your external switches or assistive devices to your iOS device using the appropriate interface, such as Bluetooth. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for connecting and configuring the switches.

Customize Switch Control: In the Switch Control settings, you can customize various aspects of the feature. For instance, you can define switch actions, adjust scanning settings, create custom gestures and more. Explore the settings to tailor Switch Control to your specific needs.

Set up switches and actions: In the Switch Control settings, tap on Switches to configure your connected switches. Assign specific actions to each switch, such as scrolling, tapping or navigating through menus. You can also create custom actions using the Custom Gesture option.

Using Reachability

Reachability is a feature on iOS devices that helps users easily access the top elements of the screen by bringing them closer to the bottom for one-handed operation without straining or adjusting grip.

How to use Reachability

- Open the **Settings** app
- Tap on Accessibility
- Tap on **Touch**
- Tap on Reachability
- Toggle the switch next to Reachability to enable it

To use Reachability, simply slide down on the bottom edge of the screen.

Adjusting on-screen and external keyboard settings

Adapting the keyboard settings can improve typing efficiency and comfort for individuals living with physical impairments.

How to adjust on-screen and external keyboard settings

- Open the Settings app
- Tap on Accessibility
- Tap on Keyboards
- Customize options such as keyboard repeat rate, key feedback and more for an optimal typing experience

Using speech-to-text

By converting text to speech, individuals can more easily consume information and communicate with others.

Enable speech-to-text:

- Open the Settings app
- Go to Accessibility and select Voice Control or Siri & Search
- Turn on Voice Control or Type to Siri to enable speech-to-text functionality
- Activate the speech-to-text feature by tapping the microphone icon on the keyboard or using voice commands

Use speech-to-text:

- Open any app that requires text input, such as Messages or Notes
- Tap on the text input field to activate the keyboard
- Tap the microphone icon on the keyboard to start dictating your text
- Speak clearly and naturally, and your speech will be converted to text in real time

Adjusting device settings and enabling accessibility features can enable users living with physical or motor impairments to control a smart home, use switch controls, operate their device with one hand, take advantage of an external keyboard and easily convert speech to text. Experiment with different settings to find what works best for you.
