
In-office/teledermatology iPledge Workflow



Patient risk PATIENT CAN GET PREGNANT categorization & pregnancy Educate patient about Isotretinoin and provide counseling regarding contraception requirements or iPledge. Once patient has been testing categorized as "cannot get Patient must complete pregnancy test at home, in-office, or at a CLIA-certified lab. A negative pregnancy test pregnant," no pregnancy result must be obtained before patient can be registered in the iPledge system. Enter negative pregancy test results in the iPledge Program system. Confirm patient counseling of program requirements in the iPledge Program system. Give patient prescription for up to a maximum Patient ☐ Have patient complete the comprehension questions in the iPledge Program system. 30-day supply of Isotretinoin. counseling & Give patient prescription for up to a maximum 30-day supply of Isotretinoin. Prescribing Inform patient they have 7 days to pick up the prescription. Inform patient they have 7 days to pick up the prescription.

*Patients with serious medical reasons, including non-pregnant female patients, can request to bypass the initial 30-day waiting period and obtain quicker access to isotretinoin.
