CALL TO ORDER

The 2025 Annual Business Meeting of the American Academy of Dermatology was called to order at 9:10 a.m. (Eastern) by Seemal R. Desai, MD, FAAD, President. He stated that this meeting had been called pursuant to the notice requirements set forth in the Academy Bylaws and under Minnesota law.

ESTABLISH QUORUM

Daniel D. Bennett, MD FAAD, Secretary-Treasurer stated that a quorum consisting of not less than 250 of the voting members was not present, but that he would check for a quorum later in the meeting.

145 On behalf of the more than 21,000 Academy members worldwide, Dr. Desai thanked these
146 companies for their continued support of dermatology and asked them to stand and be
147 recognized.

SECRETARY-TREASURER REPORT

150 Dr. Bennett stated that the 2023 Audited Financial Statements were approved by the
151 Academy Board of Directors and published in the November 2024 edition of *Dermatology*
152 *World* and available on the website. He also stated that the proceedings of the 2024 Annual
153 Business Meeting were posted to the website and included in the 2025 election book for
154 membership review and vote. Dr. Bennett noted that the financial information he would be
155 presenting for 2024 was preliminary and that the Academy was in the process of closing its
156 2024 books.

157 Dr. Bennett reflected on his experience as Secretary-Treasurer of the Academy and
158 discussed the opportunities and challenges facing both dermatologists and the Academy
159 itself. He then provided a breakdown of the Academy's revenue sources over the last two
160 years, outlining the sources from which the Academy's annual operating revenue are
161 derived and the Academy's strategic approach towards assessing revenue opportunities.
162 Dr. Bennett noted that while meeting fees have not risen as steeply as inflation, industry
163 contributions have offset meeting costs and the Academy has also been able to operate
164 more efficiently. Dr. Bennett highlighted the success of staff and the CEO in aligning
165 programs with the Academy's strategic goals and member needs.

166 Dr. Bennett noted that engaged membership is key to the Academy's success and provided
167 a very high-level overview of programs and benefits designed to serve Academy members
168 including impactful public education campaigns, leadership development programs,
169 investments in DataDerm, advocacy for fair and reasonable reimbursement, and high-
170 quality member education.

171 Dr. Bennett closed by providing words of inspiration and optimism for the future of
172 dermatology and the Academy.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

173 Dr. Desai stated that there was no unfinished business.

NEW BUSINESS

174 Dr. Desai entertained questions and comments from the floor.

175 Wayne Gulliver, MD, FAAD, proposed that the Academy develop a strategy to support
176 disabled Academy members and to ensure that disabled members had a voice in Academy
177 affairs. Dr. Gulliver's proposal received support from other members and from Dr. Desai,
178 who stated that the proposal would be considered by Academy leadership.

ADJOURNMENT

179 There being no further business, Dr. Desai reminded everyone to vote in the ongoing
180 Academy election. Dr. Desai adjourned the Annual Business Meeting of the American
181 Academy of Dermatology at 9:50 a.m. (Eastern).
