 - D stands for **DIAMETER**. While melanomas are usually greater than 6 mm, or about the size of a pencil eraser, when diagnosed, they can be smaller.
 - E stands for EVOLVING. The spot looks different from the rest or is changing in size, shape, or color.
- How to perform a skin self-exam
- How to use a free Body Mole Map to keep track of changes on their skin
- Easy tips to prevent skin cancer

I can also educate your viewers about how to find a <u>free Skin Cancer Check</u> near them. As part of this educational program designed to detect skin cancer early, member dermatologists from the American Academy of Dermatology volunteer their expertise and time to offer free skin cancer checks to the public.
