



FAITH DIRECTOR

Brothers,

As we gather tonight, I want to reflect briefly on the recent liturgical highlights, significant developments in the life of the Church, and important intention-worthy needs in our world since our last meeting.

Recent Feasts and Liturgical Celebrations - In the first few days of January we have celebrated beautiful mysteries of our Catholic faith:

- January 1 — Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, recognizing Mary's role in the life of Christ and the life of the Church, and marking the beginning of the year under her protection.

- Epiphany and the Christmas Season continued into early January, culminating in profound reflections on God revealed to the nations and the journey of faith.

2. Major World & Church Developments In the universal Church:

- The Catholic Holy Year (Jubilee 2025) recently concluded at St. Peter's, drawing a record 33.5 million pilgrims from around the world and underscoring our global call to forgiveness, peace, and spiritual renewal.

- Pope Leo XIV met with cardinals in the first major consistory of his papacy, urging the Church toward unity, evangelization, and synodality, while setting priorities for the next two years of Church life.

- Thousands of young Catholics and protestants gathered in Paris in an ecumenical pilgrimage, committing to shared prayer, reconciliation, and hope in a fractured world.

- In Gaza, Cardinal Pizzaballa visited the Holy Family Parish shortly before Christmas, offering pastoral presence to families and children amid the ongoing humanitarian crisis.

3. Prayer Intentions & Needs Our Holy Father has called us to prayer in concrete ways:

- For Christians living amid war and conflict, especially in the Middle East, that they may be "seeds of peace, reconciliation, and hope." This intention remains urgent as violence and displacement continue to impact innocent lives.

- For the Church's mission of evangelization and unity, that the Spirit guide our leaders and faithful to deepen communion and witness Christ's love in our communities.

4. Specific World & U.S. Concerns as Catholics and Knights, we turn our prayerful attention to:

- Peace in Ukraine, the Holy Land, and regions of persistent conflict.

- The dignity of the unborn and the ongoing need for a culture of life and legal protection.

- Those suffering poverty and displacement, including migrants arriving at our borders and communities in need here at home.

- Our local parishes, families, and especially those facing illness, isolation, or economic hardship in our own communities.

In Closing,

As we begin this new year, let us draw strength from the feasts we have celebrated, from the witness of our global Catholic family, and from the Holy Father's call to live faith that is active in hope, love, and peace. May the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Mother, guide us to greater fidelity to Christ in 2026.



The funds are used for the purchase of ultra sound machines to be placed in crisis pregnancy centers in the area. Find the team at the Laps 4 Life website to donate.


The spring 40 Days for Life campaign begins on February 18th and runs through March 29th. The 40 Days for Life organization reports over 26,000 babies have been saved through the years of campaigns.

The final tally of the JMJ Pregnancy Center baby bottle campaign at St. James this past October resulted in donations of \$4353. This includes funds from bottles returned (45%) and online donations.

The annual Orlando Diocese Mass for Life was held at Mary Queen of the Universe Shrine on January 23rd. The event included adoration, rosary and mass by Bishop Noonan. Students from several Catholic schools were in attendance as well as staff and volunteers from JMJ.

From the USCCB January Respect Life Prayer Guide we read:

"More than three years after the reversal of Roe v. Wade, the tragic effects of five decades of nation-wide abortion on demand largely remain. States reflect a patch-work of different laws defending or violating the right to life, yet abortion is legal in most of them. This fall voters in a number of states will face referendums on abortion, and the future of preborn children may be determined at the ballot box."



If you have a nominee, write up your justification for the award and send to Grand Knight, Chris Ewing, profcewing@gmail.com.

Thanks in advance for your involvement.

Knight of the Month Factors to consider in their search for a 'Knight of the Month':

- Has the member made significant contributions to the Church, community and/or council?
- Does the member have a robust prayer-life that goes beyond weekly Mass attendance?
- Is the member a true Catholic gentleman?
- Does the member exemplify the virtues of Knighthood?
- Does he serve as a model man to his brothers?
- The 'Knight of the Month' nominated doesn't need to be a "super Knight".

The nominated member should be a Knight that lives traditional Christian values according to his state in life (single or married) and deserves recognition for doing so.

Nomination Sources

- Nominations can be made from any council member for 'Knight of the Month'.
- Sources of member nominations can come from parish priests, council members, ministry leaders with active Knights serving their ministry, etc. These sources can also be used to get additional background information on their church, community, or ministry activities.
- Provide justification for your nomination when submitting.

Family of the Month Factors to consider in their search for a 'Family of the Month':

- Has the family made significant contributions to the Church, community and/or council?
- Is the family tight knit?
- Does the family spend quality time together?
- Does the family attend weekly Mass together?
- Does the family pray together outside of Mass?
- Does the family serve as a model of Catholic family values?
- The "Family of the Month" nominated family doesn't need to be a "super family". The nominated family should be a family that lives traditional Christian family values and deserves recognition for doing so.
- It is not required that the catholic gentlemen be a Knight to be eligible for the Family of the Month.

Nomination Sources

- Nominations can be made from any council member who knows of council member families or parish families that support family life.
- Sources of nominations can come from parish priests, neighbors, council members, ministry leaders, etc. They can be used to get recommendations, references and evaluations concerning council families. They can also speak directly to the families being considered.
- Provide justification for your nomination when submitting.





SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE



FEBRUARY 2026

“Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you [falsely] because of me.” (Gospel for Feb. 1, Mt 5:11)

In the next verse, Jesus continues, “Thus they persecuted the prophets who were before you” (Mt 5:12b). His words imply that his disciples are prophets in their own right, following after the prophets of old. Indeed, as his disciples, we become priests, prophets and kings by virtue of our baptism. In our prophetic role, we are called to speak God’s truth even when it is unpopular in the eyes of the world.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to learn more about the Church’s teachings on one or two contemporary issues that you are concerned about, so that you can better defend the truth when an opportunity arises. Look to the Catechism of the Catholic Church and booklets from the Order’s Catholic Information Service (kofc.org/cis) as resources.

Questions for Reflection:

Do you shy away from speaking the truth because you fear opposition or repercussions? Does your silence on issues of faith or morals sometimes give others the false impression of agreement? How do you make sure you are being respectful and charitable to others when speaking the truth?



Since 2009, Knights have helped place over 1,900 ultrasound machines, valued at \$91 million, in pro-life clinics and pregnancy centers—135 of those here in Florida. Local councils fund half the cost; the Supreme Council covers the rest. For fully funded mobile units, Supreme may cover 100% of the ultrasound machine cost.

FROM THE WORTHY LECTURER

Blessed Giacomo (James) Alberione

January 25th is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, so this is an appropriate time to talk about one of the three reliques contained in the altar here at St. James Cathedral - that of Blessed Giacomo (James) Alberione.

Blessed James was the founder of what is known as the Pauline Family of religious congregations, ten orders and religious institutes that include the Society of St. Paul for priests (abbreviated as SSP), the Daughters of St. Paul, Pious Disciples of the Divine Master and Sisters of Jesus the Good Shepherd (known as the Pastorelle Sisters) for religious women, and the Pauline Cooperators for laymen and lay women.

Born in 1884 in the Piedmont region of northern Italy, Blessed James was one of six children born into a farming family. He entered junior seminary at the age of twelve but was asked to leave four years later. A biographer in Butler's Lives of the Saints suspects that his departure may have been for disciplinary reasons.

Six months later, he enrolled in the seminary at Alba south of Turin, Italy. He was in the habit of rising before dawn to spend time in vigil before the tabernacle, and on the night of December 31, 1900 he felt a sudden call to do something special to serve the people of the new century. This calling did not become clear for several years.

Blessed James was ordained in 1907 and spent some time as a parish priest before being appointed a spiritual director at the Alba seminary. In 1913, he became director of the weekly Alba Gazette, his first involvement in mass communications. He saw the Church's need to engage with the communications media both to defend itself against hostile propaganda and to spread the Good News.

To accomplish this, he founded five religious orders for priests, religious and laypersons over the next twenty years. The Constitutions of the Paulines require them to "work for the glory of God and the salvation of other souls through the modern media of communication." To this end, he saw that periodicals (that is newspapers and magazines) would be an effective way of spreading the gospel with a wider reach than that of books alone. Over the next fifty years, the Paulines would publish separate periodicals devoted to diverse subjects such as Christian family life; Pastoral life of priests; the "beauty and grandeur of Mary"; Vocations and priestly formation; Catechesis; and "The Little Newspaper" for children.

As a major religious superior, Blessed James attended the Second Vatican Council where he participated in the drafting of the Council decrees.


Upon his retirement as superior general of the Paulines in 1969, Pope Paul VI presented him with the papal cross *Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice* (For the Church and the Pope), saying "Here he is, humble, silent, tireless, always vigilant, recollected in his thoughts, which run from prayer to action, always intent on... [finding] ...the most creative way to reach souls. Our Fr. Alberione has given the Church new instruments with which to express herself, new means to give vigor and new breadth to her apostolate."

Two years later in 1971, Fr. Alberione was visited by the Pope as he lay on his deathbed. Hours later, he died at the age of 87. His cause for canonization was approved in 1981, and he was declared Venerable in 1996. At his beatification in 2003, Pope John Paul II recalled that Blessed James' mission was "to make Jesus Christ, the Way, the Truth, and the Life known to the people of our time with the means of our time."

Today the Pauline Family's apostolate produces and publishes new media - including video, radio, TV, internet, apps and other digital tools - alongside books and other printed matter. Based in Italy, they have a presence in over sixty countries, and its United States provincial headquarters is in Staten Island, New York.

Behind the carving of the loaves and fishes on the back panel of our altar is an aperture containing relics of St. Catherine LaBouré, St. Teresa of Calcutta, and Blessed Giacomo (James) Alberione. Bishop Noonan's cathedra sits behind the altar, facing the loaves and fishes carving. On the arms of the cathedra are two carvings, St. Peter and St. Paul. I like to think that the design is not a coincidence. Because here we have St. Paul, the patron and protector of the Paulines, overlooking a relic of the Founder of the Order - the Holy Spirit at work.

Blessed Giacomo Alberione, pray for us. St. Paul, pray for us.





Knights of Columbus: A Legacy of Charity and Faith

The Knights of Columbus were founded in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney with a mission of charity. The Order quickly expanded beyond the United States, and during World War I, they established welcoming huts offering free services to all. In the 1920s, the Knights advocated for anti-defamation and religious freedom. They renewed their commitment to volunteer service during the Great Depression and later focused on combating communism and fascism post-World War II. In the 1950s, they played a key role in adding "under God" to the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance. The Knights continued to support ecclesial reform and strengthen ties with the Vatican, especially during John Paul II's pontificate.

Into the new millennium, they maintained their charitable work, aiding displaced Christians in the 2010s. The beatification of Father McGivney in 2020 marked a new chapter, with the Order launching initiatives to deepen faith and fraternity. The Knights' history is a testament to their enduring dedication to charity and service.

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast. We humbly ask that you glorify your venerable servant Father Michael J. McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will. Through his intercession, grant the favor I now present (here make your request). Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
