


2017 will be remembered as the year of the woman. The discussions and movement around gender parity and overall respect for women in the workforce dominated the news cycle. TIFF took its stand early in the year with the launch of Share Her Journey, a fundraising campaign focused on supporting women in front of and behind the camera. The response was resoundingly positive from all our stakeholders, and the campaign continues to grow.

It was also a year of significant shifts in the filmmaking world. Diversity and marginalized characters challenged the status quo: Luca Guadagnino's Call Me by Your Name and Guillermo del Toro's The Shape of Water reminded us what unconditional love looks like; Sebastián Lelio shared a story that has never been told with A Fantastic Woman; and Agnès Varda, aged 89 and in her seventh decade as a director, made a resurgence as the coolest woman working in film. The work of these artists and activists has become

a staple for TIFF, and as a charitable arts organization it is not only our responsibility to uphold and support these voices and others like them, but also our honour to do so. Our offerings during the Festival and year-round often mirror what is happening in the zeitgeist, and our global film community is brimming with an unconventional creativity that is truth-telling like never before. The combination brought us some of the most powerful filmmaking we have seen in years.

Looking forward, 2018 will bring both a change in leadership in the organization and a new strategic plan focussing on the next five years and a new iteration of TIFF. What does the future look like? As the largest public film festival in the world, and a hub for world and new cinema year-round, our focus is on you, the audience. TIFF, in partnership with its diverse and committed supporters, will continue to provide a safe space for lovers, seekers, and creators to celebrate cinema and storytelling.

Over the past 42 years, TIFF has meant something different to different stakeholders at different times: a Festival of Festivals, a charity, a platform for discovery, the world's largest public film festival (with the best audiences), a launch pad for the awards season, and, finally, the 365-day-a-year, state-of-the-art, multi-cinema TIFF Bell Lightbox. TIFF has been, and continues to be, all these things. What distinguishes it from other organizations of its kind is its kaleidoscopic nature, which mirrors the mosaic of our audiences.

The common thread that runs through all the different identities TIFF has held over the years is the connection between art and audience, and the transformation that comes when the two meet in a safe place in the dark. Defences come down, minds are opened, judgement takes a back seat, and belief is suspended, for a brief and sacred time. And that's when true change happens. People can emerge from these darkened rooms enlightened, furious, weepy, or confused, but always transformed in some way.

The importance of the work that TIFF does lives in the promotion and preservation of not only film, but also our audiences. Without people to intersect with art, we'd have storytellers with no witnesses, and no one to carry forward the lessons and messages learned. In the quickly changing landscape of film and technology, the audience remains an integral part of what we do.

As we look back on the year that was 2017, and as TIFF moves firmly into its middle age both wiser and humbler, we are thankful that filmmaking is widening its lens to include more diverse voices to curate from, and that cinema is alive and well, even as its formats change. Our identity will continue to ebb and flow, as things do over time. We hope to expand our vision and to never be static. We are indebted to all those who care to be part of the TIFF story, and who continue to enable us and to support us in our mission.

Opportunities to engage

with film, and discover a means of expression through it, should extend to all people. TIFF has prioritized its work with non-profit community organizations to help deliver film experiences that reflect the needs, interests, and abilities of different communities. In 2017 we collaborated on film-based programming with Sheena's Place, a not-for-profit that supports individuals, families, and friends affected by eating disorders. We also worked on a Special Delivery workshop that connected filmmaker Charles Officer with Villaways, a publichousing community facing imposed relocation, which inspired Officer's acclaimed documentary Unarmed Verses, winner of both the Canada's Top Ten People's Choice Award and the Best Canadian Feature Documentary Award at Hot Docs '17.

Each year, with the help of many donors and supporters, we provide thousands of free tickets to children and community members through a variety of community support initiatives. In 2017 we provided free access to over 4,500 individuals who wouldn't otherwise have been able to experience our cultural and educational programming, through our Pocket Fund, TIFF Gives, and Reel Magic initiatives.

TIFF's Canada on Screen programme, co-produced with Library and Archives Canada, the Cinémathèque québécoise, and The Cinematheque in Vancouver, was the most ambitious retrospective of Canada's moving-image heritage to date.

The exhibition 2167, a virtual-reality project conducted in collaboration with imagineNATIVE, Pinnguag, the Initiative for Indigenous Futures, and supported by the Harbinger Foundation, saw Indigenous filmmakers and artists imagine Indigenous life 150 vears in the future.

Canada on Screen's installations celebrated Canadian artists Michael Snow, Stan Douglas, Vera Frenkel, Rodney Graham, Roman Kroiter, Colin Low. and Hugh O'Connor, and the Ontario Place Cinesphere hosted special screenings of the Canadian classic North of Superior (1971).

Three Canada on Screen film selections were also restored and deposited with the Film Reference Library for future screening: I've Heard the Mermaids Singing (1987), Picture of Light (1994), and Rude (1995).

Canada à l'écran a présenté des expositions telles que 2167, organisée en collaboration avec imagineNATIVE, Pinnguaq et l'Initiative for Indigenous Futures, et soutenue par la Fondation Harbinger. The TIFF Kids International Film Festival sees the next generation of cinephiles take over TIFF Bell Lightbox for nine days with their unbridled passion, enthusiasm, and curiosity for film. The 20th edition of the festival, supported by the City of Toronto and the Ontario Arts Council, featured our biggest lineup to date, with more than 160 films from over 40 countries screened. The films explored themes such as empathy, family, identity, immigration, and embracing diversity.

The 2017 festival kicked off with a sold-out premiere screening of *Smurfs: The Lost Village*, and featured director Kelly Asbury in attendance. Other highlights included the 15th anniversary of *Whale Rider* (2002) and an exclusive premiere of two episodes of Disney Channel's *Tangled: The Series*, with ticket sales donated to Pocket Fund.

Artistic Excellence Cinema is an art form with endless possibilities. Our curatorial choices are based on a deep respect for, and profound belief in, the medium, its creators, and its viewers. Nothing inspires us more than creating a space where audiences can experience, enjoy, and discuss the best world and Canadian cinema, in the most engaging presentations possible. In 2017, Theatrical Programming proudly presented 56 New Release films at TIFF Bell Lightbox, 26 of which were foreignlanguage titles. Among them were Human Flow from China, five films from the United Kingdom, Secret Superstar from India, as well as a number of films directed by women, including Toni Erdmann, Window Horses (The Poetic Persian Epiphany of Rosie Ming), and The Wedding Plan, and films with LGBTQ+ stories, such as Moonlight, God's Own Country, and Call Me by Your Name. TIFF Film Circuit works alongside local organizers to bring the very best of Canadian and international films and artists to communities throughout Canada. Film Circuit is generously supported by Telefilm Canada, the Ontario Media Development Corporation, and Cineplex Entertainment.

As part of the Canada on Screen initiative, Film Circuit celebrated National Canadian Film Day and Canada 150 with 175 free screenings of classic Canadian titles across 106 Film Circuit locations. The success of Canadian co-production Maudie (2016) was celebrated with guest appearances by producer Mary Young Leckie and executive producer Heather Haldane across 10 Film Circuit locations, which helped make *Maudie* the highest-grossing movie in Film Circuit history.

The Films of Andrei Tarkovsky Poetry of Apocalypse: The Films of Andrei Tarkovsky was the first Toronto retrospective in 15 years devoted to the visionary Russian auteur. Comprised of eight of Tarkovsky's works, including multiple 35mm prints and three digital restorations, this TIFF Cinematheque series enjoyed multiple sold-out screenings and full theatrical runs, two of which lasted several weeks: sci-fi classics Solaris (1972) and Stalker (1979). Filmmaker Mira Nair (left) spoke about Queen of Katwe (above) TIFF solidified offerings for film seekers of all ages and galvanized new audiences in 2017. We worked closely with programming partner Penguin Random House to bring acclaimed authors to TIFF Bell Lightbox for our annual Books on Film series. More than 3,000 attendees enjoyed intimate onstage discussions by authors Zadie Smith (Swing Time), David Lipsky (Although of Course You End Up Becoming Yourself), and Colm Tóibín (Brooklyn), screenwriter Phyllis Nagy (Carol), filmmaker Mira Nair (Queen of Katwe), and actor-director Sarah Polley (Away From Her).

The Higher Learning and Film Reference Library teams hosted an intensive two-day symposium with 23 emerging professionals and students in the library, archive, and museum fields that investigated how these institutions help define our communities and cultures.

Our TIFF School and Family Programmes

feature camps, school screenings, and hands-on workshops that touch on all aspects of storytelling, including pixillation, special-effects makeup, and filmmaking, and offering in-class filmmaking residencies tailored for children and youth.

Students are encouraged to discover filmmaking concepts, learn about the technology behind creative work, and develop skills to appreciate new perspectives and representations in cinema, empowering them to pursue their creative endeavours.

In the fall of 2017, TIFF School unveiled the In-Class Filmmaking Residency programme. It was created to build more in-depth filmmaking skills within school communities across the GTA and provide teachers and students with skills to share with their peers.



The Jump Cuts programmes give emerging filmmakers in grades 4–8 (TIFF Kids) and grades 9–12 (TIFF Next Wave) the opportunity to develop and showcase their own original shorts, helping them bring their vision to life on the big screen.

As part of Canada on Screen, Jump Cuts went national for the first time, receiving over 200 submissions from across the country, in a variety of genres. The competition culminated in a showcase of the finalists' films and an award ceremony. With films tackling a range of topics, from life at residential schools to an insightful look at millennials' perceptions of racial identity, this year's crop of entrants proved that emerging Canadian talent is in no short supply.

TIFF Next Wave is the heartbeat of year-round programming for young audiences at TIFF.

The sixth annual TIFF Next Wave Film Festival, presented by ESPN Films and with support from The Slaight Family Foundation, welcomed young people under 25 to attend free screenings of old favourites like The 400 Blows (1959) and Harold and Maude (1971), as well as new releases like Before the Streets (2016) and Divines (2016). The action-packed weekend also included the inaugural Young Creators Co-Lab, a full day of programming tailored specifically for youth interested in exploring the world of film and filmmaking, and popular events like the 24-Hour Film Challenge and the ever-epic Battle of the Scores competition. The festival is curated by the TIFF Next Wave Committee, a voluntary advisory team made up of 12 youth from schools across the GTA dedicated to bringing quality film programming to young film lovers. Committee members' tastes, opinions, and critical voices are as diverse and essential as they are strong, inspiring a youthful, engaging lineup that drives new voices to TIFF Bell Lightbox.

The TIFF Film Reference Library (FRL), in

partnership with the Ontario Media Development Corporation and supported by the Canada Council for the Arts, continues to provide free access to film, film resources, and Canadian cinema heritage to the public, and actively supports our TIFF programming. This year, the FRL catalogued Special Collection materials from Guy Maddin, Bruce McDonald, David Cronenberg, and Christopher Chapman, and acquired the archives of Richard Kerr, Mike Hoolboom, and Donna Szoke. The FRL also screened an exquisite IB Technicolor 35mm print of Alfred Hitchcock's classic Rear Window (1954) to a sold-out crowd, and scanned, catalogued, and re-housed 7,488 photographic slides and contact sheets covering TIFF red carpets and special

events from 1971 to 1991.



Our intensive five-day Lab, made possible by RBC, the Slaight Family Foundation, and Telefilm Canada. supported 20 Canadian and international directors in an inspirational forum that continues to attract exciting, emerging talent from around the world. 


