TIFF will grow its reach and relationships with audiences and the industry through purposeful year-round film programming and presentation of emerging storytellers who push the limits of the medium of film.

TRANSFORMATIVE

CANADIAN **FILM**

Canadian cinema has seen a remarkable surge in creativity and recognition, highlighted during the 2023 Toronto International Film Festival.

Canadian official selection titles included three Galas, plus World Premieres of new work by Deepa Mehta and Atom Egoyan and the debuts of emerging filmmakers who previously participated in TIFF Talent Labs or were previously featured in Short Cuts. Some examples include Fawzia Mirza's Queen of My Dreams, Ariane Louis-Seize's Humanist Vampire Seeking Consenting Suicidal Person, Meredith Hama-Brown's Seagrass, and Cody Lightning's Hey, Viktor!


The Festival TIFF Classics section also presented the World Premiere 4K restoration of the 1985 Oscar-winning feature documentary *Artie Shaw: Time Is All You've Got* by Brigitte Berman. The restoration was made possible through a grant from Telefilm's Cinema Reignited Project as part of its digitization initiative. *The restoration of Artie Shaw: Time Is All You've* Got was overseen by Berman with the generous financial support of Donald Hicks, and made possible through Canadian Cinema — Reignited, a Telefilm Canada initiative, in partnership with TIFF.

In March, TIFF Cinematheque presented the series Reformation: Contemporary Québec Cinema, curated by former TIFF programmer and current Director of Industry and Community Relations at Cinespace Studios, Magali Simard. This series was born out of contemporary Québec cinema's approach to visual storytelling. These eight films presented a spectrum of observation and reflection of the very process of social transformation, and include Chloé Robichaud's Boundaries, the late Jeff Barnaby's Blood Quantum, Sophie Deraspe's Antigone, Sébastien Pilote's The Auction, Denis Côté's Bestiaire, Maxime Giroux's Félix et Meira, Ivan Grbovic's Drunken Birds, and Philippe Lesage's Genesis.

In November, TIFF Cinematheque's free monthly See the North series premiered the restoration of Guy Maddin's Archangel — also funded by Telefilm's Cinema Reignited Project. TIFF Members had the opportunity to meet the filmmaker at an exclusive event, which was also attended by stakeholders from Telefilm and Films We Like, in the recently launched Varda and renovated third-floor space.

NEW RELEASES

While TIFF Lightbox undertook renovations to the third floor (including a six-month closure of Cinemas 4 and 5), TIFF's 2023 New Releases saw an exceptional return of audiences with a 14% increase YOY in annual box office.

NEW RELEASE HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDED

Toronto's own Celine Song's feature film debut *Past Lives* was the top New Release running for 13 weeks with a gross of over \$140,000.


Ponniyin Selvan: Part 2, the sequel to TIFF highestgrossing film of 2022, saw audiences return for the epic conclusion to the Cholas' story. The film held for six weeks and grossed more than \$64,000.

Anatomy of a Fall opened at TIFF Lightbox during week three of its North American release, but the Lightbox still managed to become the #3-grossing cinema for the film in North America, and #2 in Canada (behind Montreal).

Audiences craved stories from Canadian talent with Sarah Polley's *Women Talking* (#2), Chandler Levack's *I Like Movies* (#9), and Anthony Shim's *Riceboy Sleeps* (#10), along with the aforementioned Celine Song's *Past Lives* (#1).

PAST LIVES (dir. Celine Song)

Throughout the year, TIFF welcomed more than 70 in-cinema guests to talk to audiences about their films, including Luis de Filippis, Carmen Madonia, and Julia Fox for *Something You Said Last Night*; Emma Seligman for *Shiva Baby*; Vuk Lungolov-Klotz for *Mutt*; Ariane Louis-Seize for *Humanist Vampire Seeking Consenting Suicidal Person*; lain Reid for *Foe*; and Sean Price Williams for *The Sweet East*.



TIFF CINEMATHEQUE

TIFF Cinematheque's Free for Members programme, now in its second year, saw a surge in attendance and productive partnerships with other film and national cultural institutions. These partnerships enriched Cinematheque's offerings, which included TIFF's first marquee event, *POP Japan*; new essentials; classics; rarities; recently restored films; and more.





May 10-June 27

The ideation for *POP Japan*, a series celebrating the convergence of the cult, pulp, and popular in Japanese film and art, originated with TIFF Cinematheque's request to participate in the Japan Foundation's tour of six 35mm prints from iconoclast filmmaker Seijun Suzuki's oeuvre to celebrate his centenary. The Suzuki restoration would be one of the three programmes under the POP Japan series, which was led by the Public Programming department as the first official marquee event.

POP Japan comprised three sub-series: Seijun Suzuki; World of Anime, a survey of Japan's most influential animes; and Miyazaki Spotlight, a four-film ode to the "godfather of animation" and co-founder of Studio Ghibli. The series was supported by in-house and creator-generated creative content; recorded introductions from series programmers; a TIFF-produced art exhibit, ikebana demonstration, and mural painting all within TIFF's atrium spaces.

STAYING ALIVE:

November 9–28

Acclaimed German auteur Christian Petzold was celebrated in a 16-film retrospective on the heels of his latest award-winning hit *Afire*. This retrospective was curated by TIFF Cinematheque Senior Curator Andréa Picard and was one of the largest ever assembled on the director's work, featuring a number of imported archival prints and supported by a presenting partnership with the Goethe Institute. The retrospective featured recorded content from the filmmaker and in-person introductions by critic Adam Nayman. Series highlights included Transit, Undine, The State I Am In, and TV mini-series *Dreileben*.

Series launch November 7



In collaboration with the Film Reference Library (FRL), TIFF Cinematheque launched a new monthly programming series of 35mm films from the library, curated and introduced by CEO Cameron Bailey, with post-screening discussions for Members in Varda.

This series celebrates TIFF's important collection of more than 3,500 35mm film prints, many acquired from the Ontario Film Institute in 1990, and its significant role in cultural preservation and education. Highlights of the series thus far have been Krzysztof Kieślowski's *Three Colours: Blue* and Jane Campion's *The Piano*.

ARTIE SHAW: TIME IS ALL YOU'VE GOT

The Film Reference Library enhanced public access to its collection by expanding displays at TIFF Lightbox, featuring archival posters from our collection; an installation of historical film trunks; and most excitingly, the iconic Scott Pilgrim vs. The World Ramona Flowers costume from the NBC-Universal Archives in Los Angeles.

The reference area extended to the fourth floor, accommodating patrons during the third floor renovations. Finally, TIFF piloted a new partnership with the University of Toronto Master of Museum Studies program to bring in student curators to activate our collections. TIFF collaborated with three graduate students who curated The Past in Play, a free public exhibition exploring nostalgia in film.

The FRL continued to complete the behind-the-scenes work of improving TIFF's collection and supporting scholarly research. Efforts also included cataloging the Helen Arthurs, Liaison of Independent Filmmakers of Toronto, Ramiro Puerta and Women & Film International Film Festival 1973 Collections. The FRL strengthened TIFF's relationship with the international community of film archives and cinematheques by attending the annual FIAF

(International Federation of Film Archivists) Congress in Mexico City in April 2023.

Technical Production Services worked closely with the FRL to complete the multi-year Film Acquisition Project, making 127 titles available for loans to other film archives. This project involved the inspection, re-housing, and preservation of prints donated by Mongrel Media, eOne Entertainment, Criterion, and NBC Universal.

In 2023, TIFF continued as a partner on the Telefilm Digitization Project, supporting the curation, digitization, and preservation of seminal Canadian feature films. The restoration of Artie Shaw: Time Is All You've Got was overseen by Berman with the generous financial support of Donald Hicks, and made possible through Canadian Cinema — Reignited, a Telefilm Canada initiative, in partnership with TIFF.

In 2023, the Digital Asset Management (DAM) Project allowed us to make significant strides in enhancing online accessibility, optimizing efficiency, and ensuring the security of our assets by implementing a new Digital Asset Management System, MediaValet.

The FRL awarded Emma Roberts the Jeffrey and Sandra Lyons Canadian Film Scholarship to continue her research on Allan King's CBC film Who's In Charge? (1983). The goal of the scholarship is to encourage the development of scholarly contributions related to Canadian cinema, through the use of the Film Reference Library collection.






FILM CIRCUIT

In 2023, TIFF continued its national film outreach programme, Film Circuit. Continuing its rich tradition of bringing the best of Canadian and international films and artists to communities across the nation, Film Circuit has expanded its outreach supporting 100+ locations since relaunching in 2022, after a two-year hiatus.

SOLO (dir. Sophie Dupuis)

Film Circuit not only extends the theatrical life of films beyond their initial release, but also champions independent films operating outside the traditional distribution model by working with emerging and local filmmakers to facilitate access for Circuit locations. TIFF 2023 award-winning films such as Mr. Dressup: The Magic of Make-Believe and Solo; The Queen of My Dreams; and Rojek, Canada's submission for Best International Feature Film, are a few of the Canadian films that were featured on screens coast-to-coast. Film Circuit groups also had the chance to catch some of the most talked about international films and hidden gems, including Anatomy of a Fall, Past Lives, Monster, A Difficult Year, and The Persian Version.

KEY 2023 YEAR-ROUND HIGHLIGHTS

TIFF brought on Pinterest as an official media partner for TIFF '23, collaborating on a number of events and content pieces leading up to and during the Festival.

Snapchat came on as a partner during TIFF '23, sponsoring our Next Wave Block Party on Festival Street over opening weekend.

KEY FESTIVAL 2023 HIGHLIGHTS

TIFF generated 22,693,726 impressions on Instagram (a new record during Festival), more than doubling 2022's performance.

TIFF generated 15,106,167 views on TikTok (up from 7.5 million in 2022); 573,639 impressions on Pinterest; and 9,414,450 impressions on YouTube.



In 2023, 42 of TIFF's 2023 talent development participants were women or non-binary people, and 14 of them received fellowships generously supported by Share Her Journey donors. More than 100 films in Official Selection at the 2023 Toronto International Film Festival were directed by women and non-binary people. That's 33% of all films in Official Selection — more than double the percentage of top-performing films directed by women in the same year (14%, via the 2023 Celluloid Ceiling report).

Fawzia Mirza, CHANEL Women Writers' Network member and a 2020 alum of Filmmaker Lab and Writers' Studio, had their feature debut The Queen of My Dreams, starring TIFF Rising Star and Share Her Journey Fellow Amrit Kaur, screened as TIFF 2023 Official Selection. The film went on to win the top Canadian prize at Reel Asian Film Festival, and was chosen for one of the coveted spots in Canada's Top Ten.

In 2023, TIFF launched the TIFF Every Story Accelerator, part of the RBC Screen Creators' Initiative, to advance projects from emerging BIPOC creators. Two producer/ director teams with feature-length projects in postproduction received targeted support to pitch their projects to industry decision-makers in three key markets.



In 2023, TIFF cultivated relationships with 65 community partners to increase access to the Festival and welcome new audiences at TIFF Lightbox. We distributed 660 tickets to equity-deserving communities through the Sharing the Screen program supported by Visa. This included February's intimate creator talk with Catherine Hernandez, where individuals from grassroots literary organizations and Scarborough communities had an opportunity to engage with Hernandez about the magical connection between books and film. In September, TIFF hosted a festival creator talk event with Canada's Top Ten director Fawzia Mirza about her film *The Queen of My Dreams* through an intimate gathering with emerging queer, South Asian, and BIPOC filmmakers.

Year-round, TIFF collaborated with longtime and new community partners to design opportunities for film lovers to connect at TIFF Lightbox. Highlights include a talk about the power of film to give voice to mental health experiences with Carol Nguyen for Bell Let's Talk Day; a screening of *Somewhere In* and talk about cultural production and representation with Say Somali; a screening, talk, and intimate workshop led by Maya Cade on Black Archives in partnership with BIPOC TV & Film; a special Pride screening of Chocolate Babies with director Stephen Winter, followed by a reception co-created with Black Gay Men's Network; and the first ever Unify Deaf Film Festival and networking event with Undivided Productions.

During TIFF 2023, Volunteers continued to maintain their welcoming and enthusiastic presence to deliver a superior Festival experience. In September, more than 1,500 TIFF Volunteers spread across our city to provide over 35,000 hours of service, helping ensure an unforgettable experience for all attendees.

WOLUNTEERS

The Volunteer Programme wasn't limited to Festival year-round Volunteers helped enhance TIFF programming, whether it be facilitating Member Meet-ups, assisting with Film Reference Library research, or supporting events, providing over 2,000 hours of service. For 2024, both Festival and year-round promise further growth. 94.97% of respondents to the Volunteer Feedback Survey indicated their desire to return for Festival 2024 (a 2.33% increase from indicated interest for 2023). In January 2024 alone, year-round Volunteers provided 218.75 hours of service, a 46% increase from January 2023. We're grateful for our hardworking Volunteers' loyalty and continued support, and thank them for making this past year unforgettable.

PUBLIC SPACES

In 2023, TIFF continued to grow its Public Spaces portfolio dedicated to dynamically boosting the TIFF Lightbox year-round environment through innovative programming partnerships, installations, and artist activations that animate the building and attract new audiences.

Building bridges with Toronto's diverse creative communities, TIFF activated the atrium with three free public art exhibitions, two murals, and seven art activations through partnerships with Manifesto, Hong Luck Kung Fu Club, City of Toronto StreetARToronto, and more.

TIFF once again hosted the City of Toronto's Doors Open event, bringing visitors through the Lightbox on a tour and participatory quiz focused on this year's theme of sound. TIFF Cinematheque's *Power & Poetry* series jumped off the screen with artist activations in the atrium, including an interactive chalk mural by Kseniya Tsoy and traditional dance performance by Navillera Korean Dance Company.

TIFF closed out the year with our largest free atrium gallery exhibition to date, Here to Stay, co-created with Nia Centre for the Arts, which amplified TIFF's Viola Desmond Day programming, inspired by the theme of 'taking up space'.

TIFF's Viola Desmond Cinema campaign commemorates the groundbreaking human rights and social justice legacy of Viola Desmond and her sister Wanda Robson. In November, TIFF was thrilled to name our largest cinema the Viola Desmond Cinema supported by NBCUniversal.

The revitalization of the third floor in 2023 has made a significant impact on reinventing TIFF Lightbox and the overall visitor experience in the building. In recognition of their ongoing support, TIFF Members were given exclusive first access to the revitalized third floor in 2023, followed by a public opening on October 6, 2023.

Varda quickly became a destination where film lovers go to enjoy great coffee, delicious cocktails, and snacks, and feel a part of the film loving community in the city. Varda has seen many young new faces who come to have a coffee while they work on laptops, meet friends for drinks, or pose for Instagram pics in front of the vintage film poster gallery wall in the corridor outside.

TIFF '23 delivered its biggest audiences since before the pandemic, despite the challenges posed by the SAG and WGA strikes, which limited the participation of talent. The Festival maintained its international focus, with more than 70% of the Official Selection comprised of global films. Galas from East Asia and India offered some of the most spectacular red carpets and fan zones, with global stars from Andy Lau to Anil Kapoor to Lee Byung-hun. Outside the cinemas, the streets came alive with partners from Toronto's diverse arts community and capped it all off with a massive, free concert in the heart of downtown.


In an effort to continue to share the Festival's curatorial priorities and mission, the Contemporary World Cinema programme was reimagined as 'Centrepiece' to highlight the Festival's long-term commitment to showcasing highly anticipated premieres from local and international talents,

as well as acclaimed work from festivals around the world. Within Centrepiece, TIFF Docs, and Wavelengths sections, the programme formerly known as Masters was revived as a subsection, Luminaries, featuring the latest work of influential and established auteurs. TIFF's premieres included the historic Opening Night Gala, *The Boy and the Heron* by Hiyao Miyazaki, marking the first animated film to open the Festival. Other notable premieres were the People's Choice Award winner *American Fiction*, Agnieszka Holland's urgent refugee drama *The Green Border*, and many more. These films generated significant buzz on the awards runway, further establishing TIFF as a pivotal platform for international cinema.

Joining the international stars were talent across entertainment mediums who were able to secure interim agreements and/or to travel to promote their films — among them Jessica Chastain, Ethan Hawke, Lil Nas X, Sylvester Stallone, Paul Simon, and Nicolas Cage. Platform competition — judged by Barry Jenkins, Nadine Labaki and 2022 Platform Prize winner Anthony Shim — boasted a globally diverse selection of titles from filmmakers poised to become future auteurs, including winning film *Dear Jassi*, based on a tragic true story partially set in Canada and directed by Tarsem Singh Dhandwar.

TIFF NEXT WAVE

Returning for its 12th edition, the TIFF Next Wave Film Festival took over TIFF Lightbox in April, welcoming young audiences to celebrate the future of cinema with a selection of bold new releases from around the world and special events.

OPENING NIGHT PERFORMANCE BY *DAYDREAM*, TIFF NEXT WAVE FILM FESTIVAL

More than 300 people attended the Opening Night Battle of the Scores competition, a live showdown of film and music talent. The atrium was electric as four local bands performed their music live, with daydream, a high-school pop band from Brampton, crowned the winner. The energy and engagement on Opening Night continued throughout the festival weekend with more than 400 people in attendance for a special screening of the highly-anticipated Japanese anime *Suzume*, alongside 10 Official Selection Films, all free for those under 25. We welcomed five filmmakers from the UK, Mexico, US, and Canada for in-person Q&A sessions; 21 guest speakers as part of a full-day of industry talks for emerging creators at the Young Creators Co-Lab; and 13 emerging Canadian filmmakers presented their work at the Young Creators Showcase shorts programme.

"Thank you so much to the Next Wave Committee in recognizing *We Grown Now* for the Changemaker Award. When I first began interviewing former Cabrini-Green residents years ago, I was deeply moved and surprised by the experiences they shared with me. They spoke both of the challenges and joys of life in a public housing project. Though the high rises have long since been demolished, Cabrini-Green remains an indelible part of the history of Chicago and public housing in America, and I hope the film sparks meaningful cultural conversation. Each year, the festival is curated by the TIFF Next Wave Committee, a group of 12 socially engaged teen film enthusiasts from across the Greater Toronto Area. Dedicated to bringing quality arts programming to young film lovers across the city and championing stories that go beyond the boundaries of coming-of-age films to explore authentic, diverse experiences of youth on screen, the Next Wave Committee programs events for their peers year-round at TIFF Lightbox. Highlights include

an annual 48-Hour Film Challenge competition and the launch of a new monthly screening series in 2023, tailored exclusively for under-25 audiences. The committee also curates a selection of Next Wave-approved films at the Toronto International Film Festival, and selected the recipient of the 2023 Changemaker Award to recognize a film at the festival that explores themes of social change and youth empowerment. The award was presented to *We Grown Now*, directed by Minhal Baig.

Since its inception in 2018, the TIFF Media Inclusion Initiative has worked to achieve both a more balanced, equitable, and diverse press corps, and to remove the tangible and intangible barriers that challenge equity-seeking press wishing to cover the Festival. This initiative provides specialized programming, mentorship, and other unique opportunities for new and emerging journalists who meet the criteria.

68 members of TIFF 2023's accredited media participated in this year's cohort of the Media Inclusion Initiative. Participants received Festival Media Accreditation and access to exclusive networking sessions called "Mentor Moments" with key leaders in the industry.

"I, Vrunda Bhatt, am so grateful to the entire team at TIFF for letting me be a part of TIFF '23 Media Inclusive Initiative. I grew up in a small hamlet in India, and being the first in the family to chase a career in a creative field, I had to overcome many challenges and answer many questions. When I volunteered at TIFF in 2019, I never imagined that I would be able to live the life of being a film and entertainment journalist that I once had. TIFF Industry brought programming, talent development, and business opportunities for the global film industry to Toronto. In 2023, we welcomed 4,471 professionals year-round, as well as during the Festival, to our talks and business activities, while an additional 92 TIFF Talent Development participants and alumni took part in our highly impactful and specialized labs, residencies, accelerator programmes, and alumni sessions.

New Industry initiatives introduced in 2023 included

THE SLOAN SCIENCE ON FILM SHOWCASE

The Sloan Science on Film Showcase will spotlight two science-forward feature films per year: one Official Selection title at the Toronto International Film Festival in September, and one year-round programming title at TIFF Lightbox. One screening of each film will include a discussion between a member of the film team and a scientific expert.

THE INTERNATIONAL MARKET BOOT CAMP

In preparation for this year's EFM and Marché du Film, TIFF Industry offered specialized boot camps with select industry experts, who provided guidance on how best to navigate the market. Following the boot camp, participants had exclusive access to a networking luncheon with a wider selection of industry professionals who regularly attend the market.

Some notable guests included Spike Lee, Nadine Labaki, Cord Jefferson, Guillermo del Toro, Viggo Mortensen, Joe Lewis, Ethan Hawke, Richard Linklater, Sara Rastogi, Darcy Heusel, Dylan Leiner, and Claudia Yusef. Conversation topics include feature-film development with Hoorae and Monkeypaw, adapting source works for television and feature film with Jefferson and Lulu Wang, producers on the art of collaboration and nurturing filmmaking talent, AI and ethics, intellectual property rights and consent, African cinema and its industries, and the current landscape of international series production.


Ahead of the Festival, TIFF relaunched its Membership with updated levels and programme enhancements, based on feedback from TIFF Members on what they most enjoy.

MEMBERSHIP

This included making free tickets to 300+ Cinematheque screenings a permanent initiative, elevating discounts, and expanding access to Festival events. These offerings resulted in more audiences attending more often and allowed Members to cultivate a deeper connection with fellow film lovers in the TIFF community.

FILMMAKER LAB

A five-day professional development experience during the Festival for 20 Canadian and international filmmakers, with peer-to-peer and professional mentorship and guest speaker sessions with internationally acclaimed filmmakers.

RISING STARS

A showcase of new Canadian and international acting talent, with mentorship and networking opportunities for the eight participants over three days, as well as during the Festival.

SERIES ACCELERATOR

A two-day mentorship intensive, presented by Canada Media Fund, offering tailored training for four Canadian series-creator teams from underrepresented communities to refine their pitches and develop a business plan for their projects.

THE CHANEL WOMEN WRITERS' NETWORK MICRO TALENT SUMMIT

A one-day professional development opportunity in which the four women and non-binary participants of that year's Writers' Studio receive mentorship and guidance from leading industry experts.

Newly added this year during the Festival are

SLOAN SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY PROJECT PITCH

A new initiative providing four Canadian and international creators the opportunity to pitch their science and technology-related film or episodic project. Participants deliver a presentation in front of a live audience of industry experts and decision makers. In addition to the non-competitive pitch event, each creator is awarded \$15,000 CAD to help further their project.

EVERY STORY ACCELERATOR

A new programme that aims to help advance projects from emerging creators with diverse backgrounds, who identify as Black, Indigenous, a person of colour, 2SLGBTQ+, and/or from other equity-deserving groups. Each year, two producer/ director teams with feature-length projects in post-production receive targeted support to pitch their projects to industry decision-makers in three key markets.

For all Talent Development programmes, TIFF has maintained its commitment to ensuring at least 50% of selected participants are women or non-binary creators, and at least 50% are BIPOC creators.

TIFF Talent Development programmes year-round include

WRITERS' STUDIO

A collaborative five-day intensive screenwriting lab for eight Canadian and international screenwriters to consolidate skills, exchange ideas, and develop scripts.


THE TIFF-CBC FILMS SCREENWRITER AWARD

Provides a monetary award, as well as professional script consulting and mentorship, and is open to all screenwriters from equity-deserving communities. The award is committed to fund the development of high-quality productions that reflect, represent, and reframe the diverse perspectives through character-driven stories at the centre of the Canadian experience.

TIFF CHANEL WOMEN WRITERS' NETWORK

An extension to the Writers' Studio experience for women and non-binary writers, TIFF and CHANEL provides additional support to select alumni with further opportunities to develop their scripts and connect with their peers and industry experts throughout the year.

TIFF Talent Development initiatives have been instrumental in the development of participants' careers and feature film projects. The Queen of My Dreams (2023) by Fawzia Mirza, Backspot (2023) by D. W. Waterson, and Seagrass (2023) by Meredith Hama-Brown had their world premieres at the 2023 Toronto International Film Festival — Seagrass won the FIPRESCI prize. Richelieu (2023) by Pier-Philippe Chevigny premiered at Tribeca Film Festival and was available on dTBLB; Matria by Alvaro Gago premiered at 2023 Berlinale Panorama; and Power Alley (2023) by Lillah Halla premiered at the 2023 Cannes Semaine de la Critique, where it was awarded the FIPRESCI prize.




