Reach out to local survivor groups through social media or your local burn center.

Add your viewing party to the Phoenix Society's Online Community Calendar

- Select "Submit One-Time Event"
- Follow the Calendar Submission Guidelines

Offer to sponsor attendees' Phoenix WBC registration

Provide gas cards or public transportation/ride share coverage to get to/from the party

Recruit leaders in your survivor community to encourage attendance.

Make shareable social media graphics for the event, apps/websites like canva are easy to use and free.

Send out an E-Vite for potential attendees, websites like paperless post allow you to invite 50 guests free & instantly track RSVPs

CALENDAR SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

This community calendar is for any public event open to members of the burn community.

- Please indicate your target audience (open to anyone, burn survivors only, members of your organization, etc).
- Disclose any cost associated with your event (including suggested donations).
- Fundraising events will not be posted
- You may select a primary and secondary event category. Attendees will use these categories to search for events, so make sure they accurately represent your event.

 Categories: Activities/Outings, Camp/Retreat, Education, Family-Friendly, Social, Support, Volunteer
- One-time events spanning several days are not considered recurring events.
- Include a contact email with your submission. This will be included in the event listing if individuals have questions about the event.
- Allow 3 business days for your event to appear on the calendar.
