El Programa Hispano	To help the community with housing, economic sustainability, education, wellness and domestic violence intervention and prevention services.	\$25,000
Family Building Blocks	To support therapeutic classroom experiences, home visits for families, and parent education programs through relief nursery services.	\$5,000

Kôr Community Land Trust	To support Kôr's homeownership program, which provides access to net-zero, affordable homes for Central Oregon's workforce, creating opportunities for building generational wealth and family stability.	\$10,000
Lines for Life	To support crisis intervention/mental health services for more than 1,500 people of color across Oregon.	\$10,000
MountainStar Family Relief Nursery	To support MountainStar's Parent Engagement Program in Madras, Prineville, and Redmond in Central Oregon, helping families create stable environments where their children can grow and thrive.	\$10,000

Pathfinders of Oregon	To support Mentoring Inside Out (MIO), a positive youth development mentoring program for youth currently ages 7-14 impacted by parental incarceration.	\$10,000
Proud Ground (Year 1 of 2-year commitment)	To ensure permanently affordable homeownership opportunities for low-to-moderate income families, many of whom are households of color facing inequitable housing practices.	\$25,000
Ride Connection	To support the Mobility for Health program providing historically underserved individuals in need of transportation with greater access to medical care, healthy food, and relief from social isolation.	\$25,000
Salem Harvest	To engage volunteers in the harvest food for donation to the local food distribution system. Volunteers take home up to half of the food they pick to feed children, seniors, lower income, unemployed, and homeless individuals in their homes and neighborhoods.	\$10,000
