<b>Arts for Learning Northwest</b> (Year 1 of 2-year \$50,000 commitment)	To support two arts integration programs: Right Brain (RB) arts integration in schools, and the SH/FT program, which integrates arts learning with professional mentorship.	\$25,000
<b>Caldera</b>	To support arts programming for ~250 underserved youth in Portland and Central Oregon.	\$10,000
<b>Confluences</b>	To support arts-infused educational programming for 2,150 K-12 students and teachers in Oregon.	\$10,000
<b>EngAGE Northwest</b>	To support free arts education for 1,250 youth in St. Helen's, Salem, Tigard, La Grande and Portland.	\$10,000
