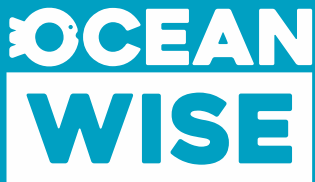

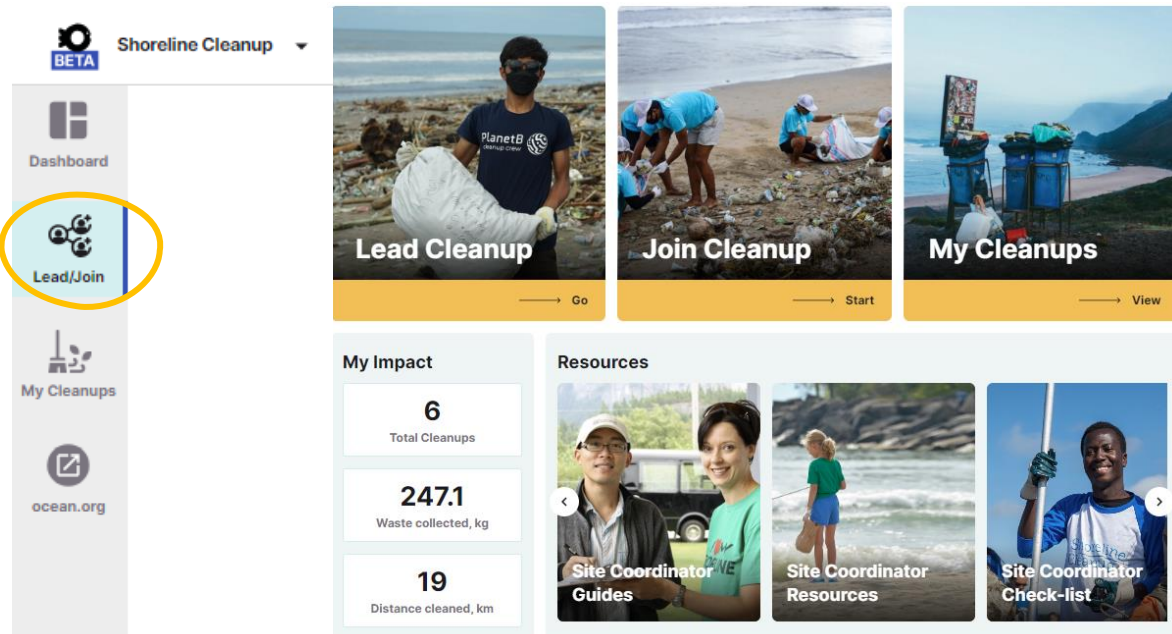

Register for the cleanup

1. Log in or create an account on [Ocean Wise - Log In](#), once you are logged in, select **Shoreline Cleanup** to jump into our program.
2. Once you are logged in, select the **Lead/Join** button located on the left menu.

Prepare for the Cleanup:

Dress appropriately: Wear comfortable clothes and closed-toe shoes that you don't mind getting dirty. Consider wearing long pants and sleeves to protect yourself from sharp objects or plants.

Bring essential items: Carry sunscreen, a hat, insect repellent, and reusable gloves to protect yourself from the elements. You are also welcome to support the organisers by bringing extra supplies you may already have in your home, such as trash / recycling bags, reusable gloves, buckets and litter pickers.

Stay hydrated: Bring a reusable water bottle to stay hydrated throughout the activity.

Coordinate transportation: Carpooling or using public transportation is encouraged to minimize the environmental impact.

Bring your phone: Remember to bring your mobile phone with you to ensure easy access to the data card.

Safety Guidelines

- **Follow the event organizer's instructions**
- **Time to team up in groups of 2-4:** Each team should have a data collector and a garbage collector.
- **Use caution & report any hazards to the organizers.**
- **Avoid sensitive environmental areas**
- **Be aware of wildlife:** Respect local wildlife and avoid touching or approaching any animals you encounter.
- **Report unusual or hazardous items:** If you come across hazardous materials or sharp objects, inform the organizers immediately and do not handle them..

During Your Cleanup

Collect Supplies

Collect the necessary cleanup supplies from the organizers, such as trash bags, gloves, buckets, and litter pickers.

Record Litter on the Digital Data Card

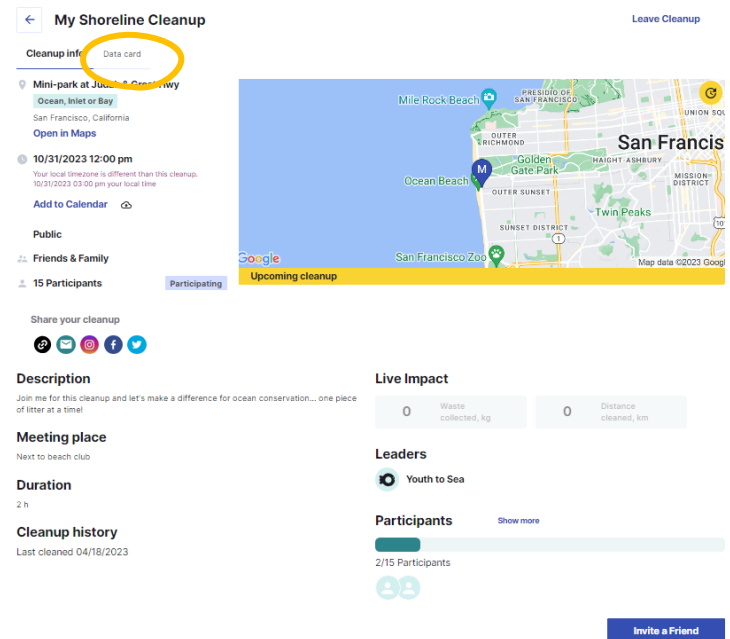
Data collected by volunteers is crucial to our citizen science program and is used to inform plastic policy! We **strongly recommend** tallying up the litter you collect as you walk along the shoreline rather than waiting until the end of the cleanup to sort and count everything. This data helps expand our understanding of the amount of litter and the most commonly found plastics.

Why is it important to use the Data Card?

Your participation in recording litter with the Data Card is an integral part of our citizen science program. By contributing this data, you are helping researchers, policymakers, and communities to gain insights into the state of our environment and the impact of plastic pollution.

Where to find the Data Card?

You can conveniently access your Data Card through the [Ocean Wise App](#) on your mobile device. Simply log in to your Ocean Wise account on [app.ocean.org](#) and navigate to "My Cleanups." Click on the "Data Card" tab that appears at the start time of the cleanup.

What's included in the Data Card?

The Data Card provides a structured format to record essential details about the litter you and your team collect during the cleanup. The items are categorized into six groups, including:

1. Most likely to find
2. Fishing gear
3. Product packaging
4. Personal hygiene items
5. Tiny trash
6. Other trash


How does it work?

When you access the Data Card, you'll have the option to input data for yourself or for a group of individuals. If you're recording data for your group, ensure you enter the number of participants and add a group name before proceeding.

As you walk along the cleanup site, the Data Card will prompt you to provide details about the type and quantity of items collected. You can easily add items by clicking the +/- buttons or typing in the number.

Submit your data!

After filling in the Data Card with the collected litter details, don't forget to submit your data. The submit button is located at the end.

After the Cleanup

Dispose of waste properly

Place all collected litter in the designated trash and recycling bags and dispose of them as instructed by the organizers. Here's how you can help the coordinators and ensure that every item finds its proper place:

- **Separate trash and recyclables by your local authority guidelines:** Familiarize yourself with local recycling guidelines to ensure you correctly identify recyclable items. When in doubt, it's best to place the item in the non-recyclable trash bag to prevent contamination of recyclables.

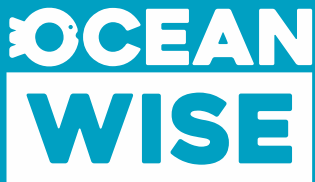
