International students are exempt from the new \$100K H-1B fee

A preferred path to a work visa is created for international students with the announcement of this exemption

- New guidance from the federal government clarifies that companies can hire international students who are studying in the US or have recently graduated <u>without</u> paying the new \$100,000 H-1B visa fee.
- This supports the administration's desire to remain globally competitive and allow top talent to stay and contribute to the US economy.
- ✓ Who this applies to:
 - Current international students wishing to apply for H-1B after graduation
 - Current OPT students wishing to apply for H-1B
 - Prospective international students wishing to enroll in 2026
- ✓ Who is not eligible:
 - Students who graduate, end their F1 visa, and return home are not eligible for the exception because they are located outside the US.
 - General guidance is that the \$100k fee will be applied for companies that hire workers who are currently living outside the US.
- ✓ There are aspects of the rule that are still being challenged in court, so there could be further changes, but for now this new guidance is great for students.
