For Edinburgh Airport, our commitment to being a Trusted Neighbour means sharing business success with those that live and work in our communities. Our Community Fund allows us to do just that. By supporting projects from community groups, charities, social enterprises, and other non-profit organisations, we want to make a meaningful, lasting difference through direct financial support of inspiring projects.

This year, the Community Fund has gone from strength to strength. It has received more applications than any year since its inception and has distributed more funding to more projects than ever. Surpassing, for the first time, the records set in 2019.

We also raised the total amount available throughout the year, from £150,000 to just over £217,000. As part of this funding uplift, we committed to funding even more projects from our November 2023 tranche in recognition of the sheer number of high-quality applications that, sadly, missed out in that round. A further £83,000 was donated, bringing the overall funds distributed throughout 2024 to £300,000.

We are proud to share our second Community Fund report, which summarises the key features of the fund, its successes, its governance, as well as highlighting some of the incredible projects we have supported this year.

CASE STUDY

Following a deliberate arson attack on the much loved Bo'Ness Model Railway, the Community Fund Board agreed an emergency payment of £7000 to help the Bo'Ness Gauge O Group get back on their feet and make repairs to the badly damaged train carriage and models contained within.

The models had been built over 30 years by a team of volunteers. Works have been underway throughout 2024 to refurbish and reopen the attraction as soon as possible.



FUND GOVERNANCE

COMMUNITY FUND BOARD

The Edinburgh Airport Community Fund Board meets three times per year – in Spring, Summer, and Autumn - to discuss applications and select projects for funding. The Board is comprised of a Chairperson, a Fund Secretary, and five additional members made up of Edinburgh Airport employees, community leaders, and a student representative.



GALA DAY PAYMENTS

Gala or cultural events such as Christmas celebrations are eligible to apply for a grant of up to £750 each year



COST OF LIVING SUPPORT

In recognition of the rising living costs affecting families in our communities, the community fund can award a grant of up to $\mathfrak{L}1,500$ to organisations combatting this, such as foodbanks



LOOKAHEAD

In 2025, the Community Fund will have a pot of up to £240,000

OUR CRITERIA

The Community Fund receives numerous applications every year and so has created clear criteria to ensure that the money we make available goes to projects that leave a lasting impact in our community. For the past three years, we have worked to align the Fund criteria with our Greater Good strategy.

THE FUND CRITERIA ARE:

- Projects should support one or more of the four pillars of our Greater Good sustainability strategy.
- Applying organisations should be based and deliver services in Edinburgh, Falkirk, Fife, or the Lothians.
- Those applying must be not-for-profit organisations such as charities, community groups, or social enterprises.
- The maximum award is £7,000. In some exceptional circumstances, this may be increased.
- Applicants must not have received a grant from the Community Fund within the last two years.
- Applications must not include requests to:

Pay for staff, salaries, consultancy, or services offered by a 3rd party.

Pay for staffing resources such as stationary, office materials

Pay for utilities or other running costs.

Pay for uniforms or sports strips.

Pay for one-off costs such as single use items, rent, licenses, subscriptions or sponsorship.

 Projects should leave a legacy and benefit as many people as possible.
