



Edinburgh Airport Carbon Policy

Principle:

Edinburgh Airport recognises the variety of emission sources generated as a result of our operating activities. Emissions are monitored on an annual basis through the carbon footprint report and there is a well established process in place for measuring, monitoring and reducing energy consumption and carbon emissions.

The airport has committed to reducing scope 1 and 2 emissions to zero by 2045 and will work in partnership with third parties to continually drive down scope 3 emissions. Our commitment to reduce energy consumption and carbon emissions is underpinned by our Energy Policy and Carbon Management Plan.

We commit to:

- Ensuring compliance with all relevant legislation and regulations
- Encouraging teams to go 'beyond compliance' when setting targets and considering carbon reduction
- Allocating sufficient resource to deliver targets and objectives as detailed in the Carbon Management Plan
- Maintaining a Building Management System (BMS) and Energy Management System (EMS) to ensure effective heating and power controls
- Provide staff with training on carbon reduction
- Consider 'carbon costs' in project planning and decision making
- Consider life cycle analysis to future proof capital developments
- Publicise our performance on an annual basis through the Corporate Responsibility Report
