Safety Bollards to be Installed Along Terminal 1 Departures Curb at Harry Reid International Airport

LAS VEGAS – Harry Reid International Airport (LAS) will be installing more than 300 bollards along the Terminal 1 Departures Curb in order to create a safer and more secure airport environment.

The \$4.9 million project will begin early in the morning on Monday, January 10, and is estimated to be completed in the first quarter of 2023.

The traveling public will need to allow additional time if departing from Terminal 1.

For the duration of the project, those departing from Terminal 1 may experience more congested airport roadways. Through traffic in the Terminal 1 departures area will be redirected to adjacent lanes in order to improve traffic flow and reduce backups (see attached visuals).

The project will be completed in seven phases, with the two traffic lanes nearest the curb closed where work is occurring. The first phase will begin at the northernmost end of the curb, near Allegiant Air and Spirit Airlines ticketing, then gradually move south with each phase.

These bollards will improve safety along the Terminal 1 Departures Curb, which constantly has a high-density mix of vehicles and pedestrians. Additionally, this project is an opportunity to replace the concrete walkways on the curb with a cost-efficient material that is more durable and easier to clean and maintain. Once completed, this updated Departures Curb will result in a safer and enhanced experience for those leaving Las Vegas.
