## ***Holiday travel tips from McCarran International Airport***

### **Parking & Passenger Pick Up**

- For 24-hour parking information, call the McCarran parking hotline at 261-5122, or valet parking at 261-6999.
- Due to heavy demand for parking, travelers are urged to "Get A Ride" by taking a taxi or bus, or ask a friend or relative to drop them off at the airport.
- McCarran's Long Term parking garage will be full for most of the holiday season. An uncovered Economy Lot and three Overflow parking lots will open as needed, though they are also expected to fill during peak periods.
- Shuttles will run continuously between uncovered parking areas and the airport's terminals. Travelers using uncovered lots should set aside at least 30 additional minutes to travel to or from the airport.
- Short Term parking and the passenger pick up curb will also be busy. Before coming to the airport to pick someone up, please check their flight status by visiting [www.mccarran.com](http://www.mccarran.com) or calling 261-4636.
- Travelers with personal digital assistants or "smart phones" can access real-time flight information at [www.flymccarran.com](http://www.flymccarran.com).

### **General Air Travel Tips**

- Many airlines allow customers to print boarding passes via the Internet. Travelers can also save time at the airport by using McCarran's free Airport SpeedCheck kiosks to check in and obtain their boarding pass.
- Customers of Delta, Southwest, United and US Airways can drop off baggage at the off-site check-in desks at Luxor, The Venetian, McCarran Rent-A-Car Center or the Las Vegas Convention Center. The Airport SpeedCheck Advance service costs \$20 for three bags. The process must be completed on the day of travel at least three hours before the scheduled departure time.
- Do not bring wrapped packages to security checkpoints. TSA screeners may inspect what's inside.
- Carry-on is restricted to one bag and one personal item, which includes purses, laptops, briefcases, diaper bags, pillows or camera cases. Also, do not pack or bring prohibited items to the airport. For a complete list, visit [www.tsa.gov](http://www.tsa.gov).
