At CCDOA we are continuing to focus on the following strategies and tactics to reduce our greenhouse gas and carbon emissions:

Measurement and Verification:

- Measure and report Scope 1 & 2 emissions through the Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA) Program and ACERT Tool

Electrification of Fleet Vehicles and Equipment:

- Transition from diesel and gasoline vehicles and buses to electric vehicles and buses
- Develop electric charging infrastructure to support our airline partners' eGSE equipment

Energy Efficiency Projects and Retrofits:

- Interior and exterior LED lighting retrofits
- Technology upgrades to central plant boilers, chillers and pumps
- LEED Certification of certain airport buildings and infrastructure
