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Thanksgiving 2022 Airport Travel Tips

A busy travel year continues into the holiday season

The second half of 2022 has seen a record number of passengers traveling through Harry Reid International Airport, and the high volume should continue throughout the holiday season. For those who have not traveled in a while, the airport is going to be busier than they remember. This means larger crowds and potentially longer wait times for everything from parking to airline check-in, security screening to food services.

Parking options will close, plan ahead

- **The Terminal 1 Long Term Garage will reach capacity and close! The smart alternative is to head directly to the Terminal 3 Long Term Garage.**
 - If traveling with only a carry-on, go through the Terminal 3 TSA Security Checkpoint and access your gate via tram.
 - If you need to check bags at Terminal 1, there is courtesy shuttle available to transport travelers between the terminals. This service is located on Level Zero of both terminals and runs approximately every 15 minutes.
- Those who plan to use the Economy Lot at Terminal 1 should set aside up to 60 additional minutes for the shuttle ride to the terminal.
- When paying for parking, be aware that cash options are limited. If you are planning to pay with cash, do so prior to returning to your vehicle.

Be prepared

- Where is my airline's ticketing counter located – Terminal 1 or Terminal 3? Which security checkpoint should I use? Is my flight on time? The answers can be found at www.HarryReidAirport.com. The website also features maps and restaurant listings and hours. Take the time to get to know the lay of the land before you leave home, and you'll be happy you did.

- Review your airline's policies, and potential charges, regarding baggage. Avoid surprises at the airport by knowing the size and weight limits for baggage, the number of items you can check and what items the airline allows on board.
- Weather delays happen. Even if the skies are clear in Las Vegas, inclement weather in other parts of the country can disrupt the entire network. Prepare for potential delays by having items on hand such as snacks, childcare essentials, medication, etc.

Picking up friends or family?

- LAS has a Cell Phone Lot located off of Kitty Hawk Way – just follow the posted signage. This short-term waiting area is offered free of charge and is open from 6 a.m. – 1 a.m. daily. Once you're on your way to Passenger Pickup, look for the numbered columns to make meeting up easier. And if your party isn't at the curb yet, pull into Short Term parking to wait. **Parking at the curb is prohibited**, but the first 15 minutes in the short term lot are free. Be sure to use the exit lane reader, not a walk-up kiosk, within that 15 minute time frame.
