From Full Throttle to Gobble Gobble: Thanksgiving 2023 Travel Tips

Harry Reid International Airport (LAS) is anticipating a busy holiday week as Formula 1 fans heading home combine with those traveling for Thanksgiving. LAS asks those flying to review the provided travel tips before heading to the airport.

Parking and transportation options

Terminal 1 parking is in high demand; **the Long-Term garage is often at capacity**. Drivers should pay attention to digital roadway signage for garage closure notifications and alternate parking instructions:

- If you want to park in long term covered parking, Terminal 3 might be your best option. If you park at Terminal 3 and your flight departs from Terminal 1:
 - No bags to check? Simply take the pedestrian bridge across to the terminal and use the Terminal 3 security checkpoint. A tram system connects Terminal 3 to the D Gates and Terminal 1.
 - If you need to check bags at Terminal 1, grab your things and hop on the inter-terminal shuttle. The shuttle stop is located on Level Zero, near Entry/Exit Door 55.
- If the Terminal 1 Economy Lot is full, throughout this week drivers will be redirected to an overflow economy lot located at 576 Kitty Hawk Way. Allow an additional 30 minutes for a shuttle to the terminal.
- Additional parking will be available at the Remote Lot located across from the Airport Rent-A-Car Center at 7140 Gilespe Street. If parking here, allow 30 additional minutes for shuttle service.

Know before you go

- Utilize options such as mobile check-in to save time.
- Weather delays happen. Even if the skies are clear in Las Vegas, inclement weather in other parts of the country can cause disruptions. Prepare for potential delays by having items on hand such as snacks, childcare essentials, medication, etc.

Picking up friends or family?

- LAS has a Cell Phone Lot located off of Kitty Hawk Way – just follow the posted signage. This short-term waiting area is offered free of charge and is open from 6 a.m. – 1 a.m. daily. Once you're on your way to Passenger Pickup, look for the numbered columns to make meeting up easier. And if your party isn't at the curb yet, pull into Short Term parking to wait. **Parking at the curb is prohibited**, but the first 15 minutes in the short-term lot are free. Be sure to use the exit lane reader, not a walk-up kiosk, within that 15-minute time frame.
