Whether you're drawn to jazz, contemporary art or the written word, Hong Kong's March cultural calendar is full of movement, melody and meaning

When: March 20–May 3

Where: Gold by Serakai Studio, G/F Remex Centre, Wong Chuk Hang

What: *Certainly*, curated by [Tobias Berger](#), is the debut exhibition at Gold by Serakai Studio, a salon-inspired space dedicated to art and design. Taking inspiration from La Monte Young's 1960 directive "Draw a straight line and follow it", the show explores creativity, deviation and chance. Artists including Tozer Pak Sheung Chuen, Lousy and Santiago Sierra examine the beauty of imperfection through diverse media.
