Oze National Park
Oze, the largest highland wetlands on Honshu, is bursting with the appeal of untouched nature. There are three entry points into Oze from Katashina: Hatomachi Pass, Fujimishita and Oshimizu.

Marunuma Kogen Summer Luge & Tree Adventure
Here there are two courses you can enjoy, both popular with adults and children alike. The luge allows you to ride a special cart down on a 800m downhill course with a height difference of 100m, while the tree adventure places you in a harness and allows you to traverse between trees using scaffolds and rope bridges.

Hotaka Bokujo Camp Site

Katashina & Nikko So Much to Eat and Enjoy!

A Whole Host of Food & Souvenirs

Locals foods and great gifts are all part of the fun when taking a trip. Here's a sampling of the treats and specialties you can find in Katashina and Nikko.

Katashina Village Gelato
Enjoy a selection of gelato made with a rich selection of local ingredients. The menu includes the hananame gelato that's so popular with Oze hikers, richly blended with the hananame beans that are a specialty of Katashina.

Katashina Village Ozedofu Zaru Tofu
Tofu made using fabled Katashina big white soy beans, which were revived after ten years of hard work. The rich flavor of the soy beans and smooth texture have won over many fans.

Katashina Village Hotaka Bokujo Jingsukan (Genghis Khan)
A famous Hotaka Bokujo dish that can be enjoyed while camping amid the vastness of nature or enjoying other activities. Dynamic preparation in a special skillet only increases the flavor.

Katashina Village Katashina Handmade Amazake
This is your chance to experience handmade "amazake", a sweet low-alcohol drink made from fermented rice. Packed with the blessings of nature, this particular amazake is made using renowned Katashina mochi rice, carefully selected malt, and snow-melt water from Oze.

Nikko City Nikko Yuba
Yuba, also known as "tofu skin" and "bean curd robes", is said to have started out as food for monks during Buddhist training. It is now eaten in a variety of different ways, including sashimi yuba, rolled up or fried.

Nikko City Nikko Pickles
Traditional Nikko pickles, made using an amber by-product called "tamari" that is produced when making soy sauce or miso. They go perfectly with white rice and also with "Chazuke" (cooked rice with green tea poured on it).

Nikko City Nikko Handmade Soba
Nikko is famous as the producer of some of the finest soba noodles in Tochigi, and this delicious example is made using locally produced flour and pure Nikko water. You can find many old-style restaurants serving handmade soba in Nikko.

Nikko City Natural Ice Shaved Ice
Shaved ice made using natural ice and time-honored methods. This natural ice is only made by five places in all of Japan, making this rare treat popular in cafes across the city.

Katashina Village Watanabe Seika Hananame Bread
This popular bread is baked using plenty of Katashina hananame beans, boiled slowly to make them super soft and delicious.

Katashina Village Roadside Roasted Sweetcorn
The famous "sweetcorn road" is located along the road from the Katashina town hall in the direction of Nikko. Katashina sweetcorn boasts a high sugar content, making it especially sweet and deliciously fragrant.

Katashina Village Large Sized Portions (Homitei)
A hit menu item for around 30 years, and by now a dish that Katashina is famous for. Apparently it got its start when construction workers visiting to work locally asked if the portions could be made any larger...

Katashina Village Katashina Highland Vegetables
Katashina highlands vegetables come highly recommended, produced by the marked temperature difference between day and night and the pure waters of the region! You can purchase them at the Roadside Station Oze Katashina. (Around late July - late September).

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Nikko City Nikko Mizuyokan
Refreshing Nikko mizuyokan is a jelled dessert made using red bean paste and plenty of fresh water from the Nikko mountains. The elegant interaction of the delicious ingredients has garnered great popularity.

Nikko City Kanaya Hotel Bakery Bread
Hefty "Royal Bread" is the most popular choice here, with a dense dough that produces a subtle texture. Then there is the cylindrical and fragrant "Cheese Lord" with a crispy toasted surface wrapped around melting cheddar cheese. Enjoy flavors that only carefully selected ingredients and traditional baking methods can produce.

Katashina Village Maitake Mushroom Dishes
Katashina is where cultivation of maitake ("hen-of-the-woods" mushrooms) started out. With carefully controlled temperature, humidity and growing periods, these delectable mushrooms have as natural a texture and fragrance as possible. You'll taste that difference not only with the famous maitake rice bowl, but also as tempura when accompanying delicious "Katashina soba", which itself is made using water selected as one of the top one-hundred in Japan.

Nikko City Cheesecake, Meiji-no-Yakata
Using cream cheese from Denmark, the Meiji-no-Yakata cheesecake is made using meticulous methods and the best ingredients. Incredibly popular, in particular for its no-bake flavor from a baked cheesecake. Also makes a great gift!

Nikko City Nikko Pudding, Nikko Pudding Tei
Pudding characterized by a full, rich flavor and subtle sweetness, made using fresh eggs from Nikko and milk from the Nikko Kirifuri Highland Ozasa Ranch. The melt-in-your-mouth texture also further brings out the delicious flavor.

Nikko Toshogu Yomei Gate (National Treasure)
A mausoleum for Ieyasu Tokugawa, and part of the Shrines and Temples of Nikko World Heritage Site. The "Hasei major repairs" have recently been completed, the first of their kind in around 40 years and restoring much of the original beauty of the gate to the "Taiyuuin" Mausoleum of Iemitsu Tokugawa, the third of the Tokugawa Shogunate.

Katashina Flower Tour

The representative flower of Oze, white skunk cabbage, is joined by a natural monument of Gunma prefecture, the Japanese azalea, and Japanese wood peeples, covering the mountainside in blooms from ancient times. Why not take the tour of all the beautiful flowers that bloom in Katashina?

Koshimoto White Skunk Cabbage Forest (Late April - Early May)
A forest of white skunk cabbage featuring around 15,000 plants. The forest is illuminated during the Golden Week period, allowing you to also enjoy the skunk cabbage at night.

Marunuma Kogen Japanese Wood Peeples (Early June - Late June)
The Japanese wood peeply pine is known as the queen of the wild mountain plants. They also form a striking contrast with the rock garden at the Nikko-Shiranesan summit station.

Haryama Tannoazakura Cherry blossom tree (Late April - Early May)
A natural monument of Gunma, this massive cherry blossom tree is thought to have lived for over 300 years. When illuminated at night, you will be transported to an illusory world.

Hotaka Bokujo Japanese Azalea (Mid-June - Late June)
Enjoy around 15,000 Japanese azaleas, the natural monuments of Gunma, as they turn the vicinity of 1,500m elevation Sangodaira bright red.

The unique environment in Nikko provides many beautiful flowers, including at Senjughahara, Lake Chuzenji and Ryuzo Falls. Taking a flower tour will also take you to the best sights in Nikko, and comes recommended at any time of year.

Ryuzo Falls Rhododendron Wadamun (Early May - Early June)
Rhododendron wadamun bring a wonderful splash of purple to the Ryuzo Falls, one of the three great waterfalls of Oumiko. The incredible contrast between the colors and the water just has to be seen to be believed.

Senjughahara Japanese Primrose (Early June - Mid-June)
Japanese primrose bloom multiple flowers off from their stems. Here you can experience them blooming so thickly that they form a veritable carpet.

Senjughahara Tussock Cottongrass (Late June - Late June)
As the name suggests, experience a vast spread of fluffy white cottongrass. This is your chance to enter an illusory, charming world.

Kirifuri Kogen Hemerocallis Esculenta (Late June - Mid-July)
Take in 260,000 hemerocallis esculenta, as they bring brilliant yellow color to highlands at an elevation of 1,600m and with a stunning view of the Kanto Plain.




Drive Destinations in Nikko

- Spectacular views from Koneise Pass**
When you emerge from Koneise Tunnel, coming from Katashina, you will immediately be greeted by some incredible scenery, with Lake Yuno, Senjogahara and Mt. Nantai all visible at the same time. This is the perfect spot to enjoy the beauty of nature at any time of year.

- Yu-daki Falls**
A large waterfall of more than 70m that appears to slip down over the rock face from Lake Yuno. The observation platform reveals the full falls in all their glory.

- Kegon Falls**
One of Japan's three greatest waterfalls, and the most famous waterfall in Nikko. From the observation platform you can enjoy the awe-inspiring majesty of these eye-catching falls.

- Akechidaira Observation Platform**
Take a trip through the air on a cabin car from Akechidaira and get a bird's eye view of some of the most beautiful spots in Nikko, including Lake Chuzenji, Kegon Falls and Byobu Falls.

- Amphibious Bus Experience**
Take a trip through the air on a cabin car that is only the first Japanese-made amphibious bus that provides the nature of surrounding the Yushigawa Dam, the dam lake, and take a tour of the inside of the dam.

The gateway to the Shrines and Temples of Nikko World Heritage Site, Kinugawa and Kawaji Onsen. As well as agricultural produce, gifts and dining from Tochigi and Nikko, you can also enjoy entertainment with a "musical" theme.

- Ninomiya Sontoku Memorial Hall**
Imaichi is where Ninomiya Sontoku (Ninomiya Kotiro) ended his 70 years of life. Here you can learn about everything this agricultural leader and philosopher brought to the region.

A cedar-lined path comprising more than 10,000 trees over 37m, and each reaching close to 30m. A designated special historic site and special natural monument.

Take a thrilling ride down the Kinugawa river. Your boatman's skilled handling of the boat and splat regarding the sights of the four seasons along the way is also a big part of the fun.

Be it an abundance of nature or long-standing history and culture, some of the best spots in all of Japan await you. Take a look at "Oze Katashina & Nikko" experiences that you simply can't fit into just a daytrip.
*The major spots between Katashina and Nikko can also be covered using seasonal bus service "Nikko-Oze Katashina express bus".

- ### 3 Full Days in Nikko and Oze Katashina
- Take in Nikko Toshogu, which has recently finished it's "Heisei major repairs", the first in around 40 years, hike in Ozegahara Marsh and then visit theme parks in the Kinugawa area or experience riding a real steam locomotive.
