

Higashi-Agatsuma Sightseeing Map

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A Hidden Ninja Town

Iwabitsu, symbol of Higashi-Agatsuma. Its imposing figure nonetheless gives off an almost motherly warmth that all are sure to be ranced by. Iwabitsu was undoubtedly the home of a sophisticated culture in the past. This is evident from the Jomon Period (2000 E) heart-shaped figures and other archeological artifacts that have been found there. Since the Jomon period, and possibly before, mountain was an object of worship and eventually became a mecca of spiritual asceticism. Some of the practitioners who came to . Iwabitsu were ninja who fought in Japan's many wars. However, this aspect of Higashi-Agatsuma's history is also shrouded in mysy. The village has always been hidden among the mountains, making it in many senses a "hidden ninja town" that few have heard of.

The Brilliant Spectacle of 300,000 Golden Daffodils Iwai Water Park's Daffodil Field

Higashi-Agatsuma is one of the few places in Japan where you can see wild daffodils. Around 300,000 bloom all at once from early- to mid-April, a season which overlaps with the cherry blossom season. At this time of year you may still see some snow along the Agatsuma river past the curtain of cherry trees as well as the snow-white mountain stream further in the distance.





A Spectacular Cave Filled with Buddhist Statues

Senninkutsu, Cavern of Sages

The 8th of the 33 Sacred Sites of Agatsuma, the Senninkutsu Cave really feels like the threshhold between this world and the next. Don't miss the many buddhist statues and the "tainai-kuguri." Legend has it that in ancient times the great Yamato Takeru slept in this cave.

Fireflies, the Harbingers of Summer

Village of Fireflies

You know summer has arrived when the fireflies appear. Countless "genji-botaru" appear downstream from the Hakoshima Yusui spring in a truly magnificent spectacle. Can be seen from June to late-July.





Emerald Canyon, National Site of Scenic Beauty Agatsuma Gorge

Agatsuma Gorge is a designated National Site of Scenic Beauty. The emerald Agatsuma River runs through the gorge and features many points of interest, including Saruhashi and Shikatobibashi Bridges, mystical rock faces, and Yanba Dam, all of which can be seen from the Shohorai viewing deck. Imagine the ninja of old hiding among this scenery and you're sure to enter a completely new world.

Hakoshima Yusui is a miraculous spring that flows from the base of a great cedar tree that is over 400 years old. Called "Hakoshima Fudo-do no Osugi," the tree is one of the town's natural monuments. Downstream you can see a luminous spectacle of fireflies in the early summer.




The Sacred Falls Where Ninja Trained

Mt. Kannon (Mt. Ryuga) is known as a spiritual center of Agatsuma where the stone image of Hyaku-kannon is enshrined. It is filled with unique sites-caverns, luminous moss, and the remains of Yanagisawa Castlebut the miraculous Fudo Falls is an absolute must-see.





Hatonoyu Onsen Sankyuro

Established in the early Edo Period (1603~), Hato no Yu has been in the onsen business for hundreds of years. It features an iconic gabled roof from the late 1800's and cloudy hot spring waters that are good for the skin. There is an old legend that pigeons used the onsen water to heal their wounds, and anyone who has experienced this chloride-rich water is bound to nod along in agreement. Known as the "finishing water" to be used after a visit to Kusatsu Onsen, Sankyuro has historically been used as a medical retreat for those suffering from illness (a practice called "toji" in Japanese).



Matsunoyu Onsen Shokeikan

This exclusive onsen only takes one group reservation at a time, but the quality hot spring waters and top-notch food is worth it. The 33-degree, fresh-from-the-source water keeps customers returning year after year. Since the facilities are completely private, you can enjoy the bath for an hour, two hours, or even longer without having to worry about other guests. The inn was made specially for onsen connoiseurs who want a pure and uninterrupted onsen experience. Also includes Japanese home-style cooking on par with the highest-quality ryokan.



Yakushi Onsen Hatago

A nostalgic getaway at the foot of Asama Kakushiyama. Look out upon to the traditional "nagayamon" gates, thatch-roofed buildings brought from all over Japan., and over 4,500 pieces of antique folk art. The massive facilities stretch over 20,000 square meters with over 20,000 railroad ties running through them. The waters of Yakushi, however, are the most alluring feature. The facilities use fresh onsen water drawn straight from the source, and Takimi-no-yu, the open-air bath that looks out upon the valley, is sure to heal both mind and body.




Kawanaka Onsen Kadohan Ryokan

Kawanaka Onsen is known as one of the 3 famous "onsen for beauties" in Japan, and Kadohan Ryokan is highly recommended by the Japan Association of Secluded Hot Spring Inns. Secluded in the lucious green of the mountains, the onsen waters here are a comfortable temperature perfect for a long soak. The gentle water is perfect for those who want soft, beautiful skin. Of course, the hot springs are also perfect for relaxation and stress relief.



Agatsuma Onsen Negoya no Yu

Located on the cliff created by the Agatsuma and Numao Rivers, the day-spa Negoya no Yu offers breathtaking views. The view from the cliffside open-air bath is superb, showing the Agatsuma river in the foreground, Mt. Akagi in the distance, and a clear blue sky overhead. The onsen is only open on Saturdays, but you'll be dazzled by the starry night sky and natural scenery seen from the open-air bath.



Azuma Onsen Kikyokan

"Straight from the source" is the motto here. Kikyokan is a pioneer on the day-spa scene in Japan. The chloride-rich waters are gentle on the skin and leave a light coating. The facilities boast a gorgeous view of Iwaido Cave and piping hot water at 51 degrees! Kikyokan was established in 1987 as a day-spa, and since then has maintained a strict "straight-from-the-source" policy. Special events are held at the spa, including a karaoke tournament. Piping hot water and energetic karaoke make this a truly unique day-trip onsen of the Showa era.



Forest Resort Conifer Iwabitsu

Conifer Iwabitsu is a resort hotel located near the Iwabitsu Castle remains that are a symbol of Agatsuma. The facilities offer a phenomenal up-close view of Mt. Iwabitsu peak. With excellent location and facilities, guests can enjoy a variety of activities, from hiking in the forest or climbing up the mountain to sports and local events. From soccer, golf and other sports to camping, barbecue, lectures and research seminars, there's something for everyone here. There is even a company-owned farm with a log cabin where guests with pets can stay. Conifer Iwabitsu is also the only onsen inn located in Agatsuma town center, Haramachi.



Agatsumakyo Onsen Tengu Hot Spring

This special day-trip onsen facility is located at the approach to Agatsuma Gorge. It was built together with the Michi no Eki (Roadside Station) Agatsumakyo in Agatsuma Fureai Park. There are a number of excellent facilities within the park, including a dog trail, various play equipment, foot baths, and cycling paths. The Onsen is perfect after a day of fun in the park or after hiking the Agatsuma Gorge. The open-air bath offers gorgeous views and offers a sense of liberation, while the private tatami rooms are perfect for a quiet moment to yourself.
