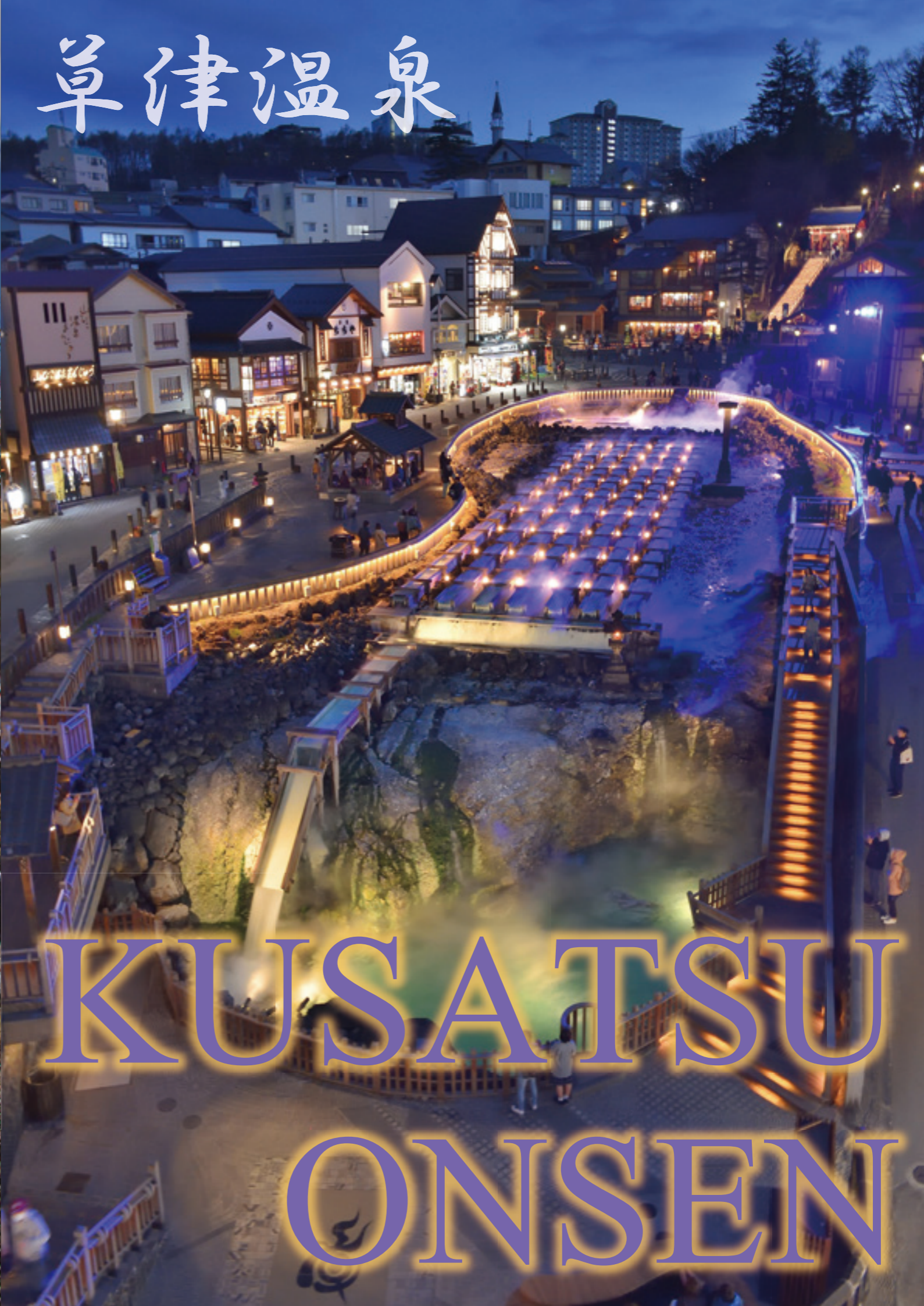




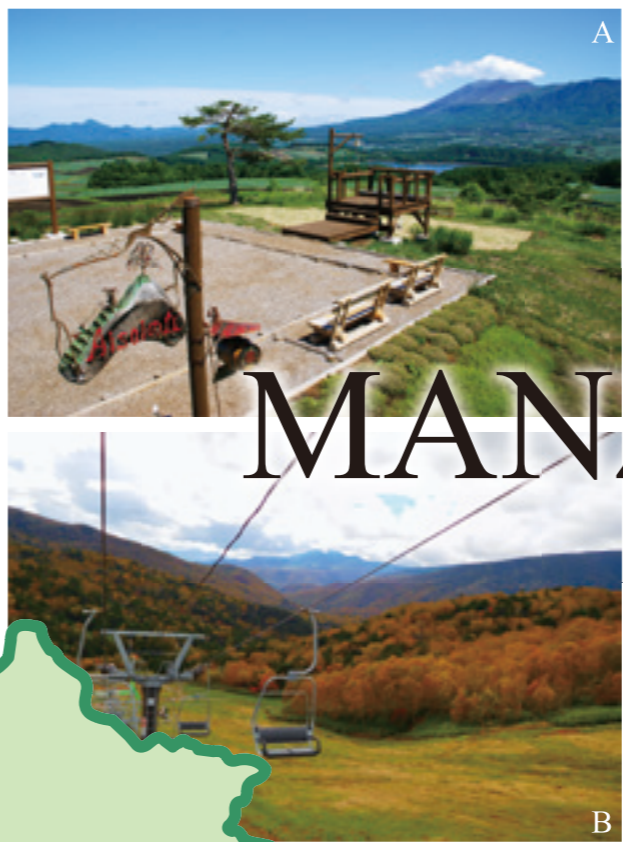

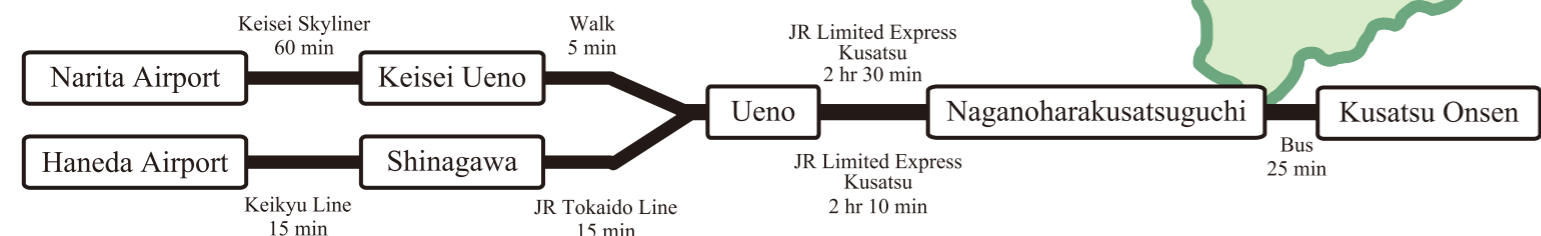


Kusatsu Onsen

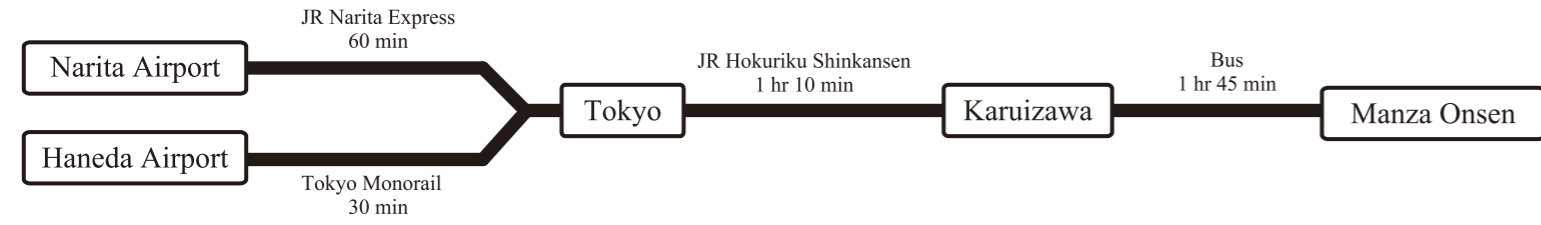
A genuine Japanese Onsen town that continually evolves

It is also well known for various other reasons, including the practice of yumomi (churning the bath water) and its unique bathing method called jikanyu, which have been passed down since the Edo Period (1603-1868). It goes without saying that the water is of the highest quality. One of its most appealing aspects is the atmosphere of the onsen town, centered on Yubatake (hot water field). 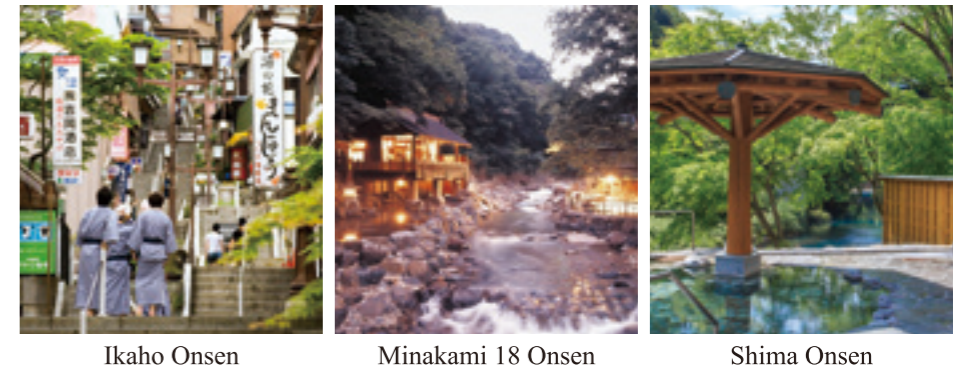


Manza Onsen
