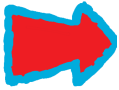
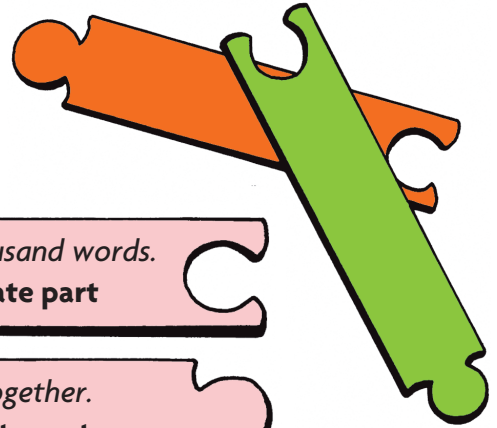




Link It Together



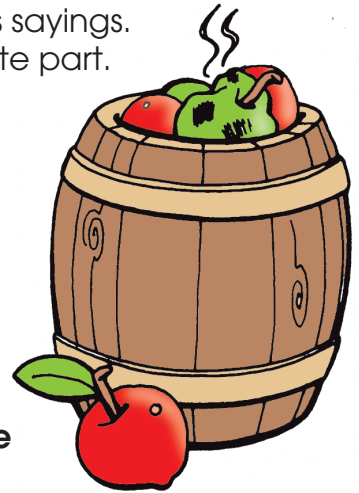
A sentence needs two parts, a subject and a predicate, to express a complete thought.
