



Landforms


Maps are usually drawn on paper, so the land looks flat. But you know that Earth's land is not always flat. In fact, the land takes many shapes called landforms. The pictures show some important landforms.



A plain is open, flat land.




A mountain is very high land with steep slopes.



A hill is land that is higher than a plain but not as high or steep as a mountain.



A plateau is high, flat land.



A valley is low land between mountains or hills. Rivers often run through a valley.



A canyon is a narrow valley with high, steep sides. Rivers sometimes flow through canyons, too.

More than half of Earth is covered with water.

You have learned about some of these bodies of water such as oceans. rivers, and lakes. The picture shows some other bodies of water and some other landforms.

A gulf is part of an ocean or sea. A gulf is partly surrounded by land.

A **bay** is like a gulf but smaller.

An **island** is land that is completely surrounded by water.

A peninsula is an "almost island." It is land that is surrounded by water on all but one side.
