Air service growth continues with Southwest Airlines announcing new daily service to Austin beginning in June 2026 and increased frequency to Nashville starting in March - both part of a significant increase in Southwest's flight volume at CVG. Frontier also resumed service to New York's LaGuardia Airport and Allegiant resumed service to New Orleans. These additions give travelers more options and strengthen our region's connectivity.

FIRST CARGO FACILITY OPENS AT GLOBAL LOGISTICS PARK

This quarter we celebrated the opening of F&F, an 80,000-square-foot cargo facility at CVG's Global Logistics Park.

CVG is already a hub for two express operations, Amazon Air and DHL Express. With direct airfield access and 18 truck docks, the new facility is designed to handle shipment of general, non-express cargo – a key step towards diversifying the cargo business at CVG.

"We believe this added capability will strengthen our position as a cargo leader and ultimately create more jobs for our region," said Lisa Sauer, chair of the Kenton County Airport Board.

F&F represents the first site developed at CVG"s Global Logistics Park, which was supported by more than \$3.6 million in Kentucky site development funds. More than \$33 million of federal infrastructure funds were leveraged to rebuild the nearby airside ramp. There are more sites available for development.

CVG INNOVATION MAKES IMPACT AT GLOBAL CONFERENCE

CVG's innovative partnerships to improve the passenger experience landed on a big stage this quarter at the annual Future Travel Experience (FTE) Global Conference. The innovation team shared its model of partnering with entrepreneurial companies through real deployments of new technology at the airport.

Featured innovations included a gamified survey experience tied to passenger wi-fi access, technology to monitor potential safety hazards at airport construction sites, light fixtures in the parking garage that signal which rows have open spaces, and kiosks that connect passengers to virtual assistance with common questions.

SOUTHWEST AIRLINES FLIGHT TO AUSTIN AMONG NEW OPTIONS FOR TRAVELERS

We continue working with our airline partners to expand options for business and leisure travelers. This quarter, Southwest Airlines began taking reservations for a new, daily, nonstop flight from CVG to Austin, with service to begin in June 2026. The airline also started selling additional frequency to Nashville starting twice daily service in March 2026.

With these additions, Southwest has grown its 2026 summer schedule at CVG by more than 40 percent over the previous summer in terms of flight volume and seat capacity. It now provides year-round service from CVG to Austin, Nashville, Baltimore, Denver, Orlando, and Chicago (Midway), in addition to seasonal service to Phoenix, with the frequency of flights increasing from 2025 to 2026.

In addition to Southwest's new service, Frontier Airlines restarted its nonstop service to New York (LGA) on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and Allegiant resumed nonstop service to New Orleans (MSY) flying twice a week.
