CVG MILESTONES IN 2023

In June 2023, British Airways launched nonstop service to London Heathrow, making CVG the exclusive gateway to London for Ohio, Kentucky, and Indiana residents. Additionally, Breeze Airways introduced year-round service to San Francisco, CA, and Charleston, SC, as well as seasonal routes to Richmond, VA; Jacksonville, FL; Providence RI; and Orange County, CA, further enhancing CVG's connectivity.

A new aircraft mechanic training facility is currently in development at CVG. The \$7 million venture between Epic Flight Academy and FEAM Aero will offer valuable on-site educational opportunities for future aircraft mechanics.

DHL unveiled plans for a \$192 million, 300,000 sq.ft. maintenance hangar at its Global Superhub at CVG, with a projected completion date in 2025.



LAND DEVELOPMENT

An aerial view of the CVG footprint showcases how aviation connected growth, combined with a strategy to lease airport property, has transformed CVG's campus in recent years.

CVG is the fastest growing cargo airport in the world, with 70% growth over the last five years. To continue this growth, CVG is working on two major projects in the coming years including Hangar Row and North Cargo Village. Hangar Row is a vision to develop 350 acres of airside real estate on the airport's south side. The project's goal is to create a one-stop-shop on airport property with the development of additional aircraft repair and maintenance operations.

Development of North Cargo Village allows CVG to continue to grow and diversify cargo operations. The airport is working to recruit additional freight forwarders, developers, and other organizations that specialize in general cargo activity: shipping large parcels and high-value goods without time-sensitive delivery requirements. These businesses would complement Amazon's and DHL's express shipping operations.

ELEVATE CVG

In the coming years, CVG will undergo a multi-year facility modernization program, Elevate CVG. One project includes the reconfiguration of the Welcome Point to install new exit lane technology on the lower level of the Terminal. Another project involves the design and installation of a new baggage handling system. The new system will enhance operational efficiency and bag processing times. Design of this critical system will take several months with construction taking place over several phases for three years.
