



HISTORIC EVENTS IN THE SECOND QUARTER

Our second quarter was marked with celebration and milestone events. With the launch of British Airways' nonstop service to London Heathrow in June, there was much fanfare for the first-ever service to London Heathrow Airport. We were extremely proud to welcome our 14th passenger airline, which will have an enormous positive impact on this region for years to come. In fact, the London flight will have more than \$172 million in economic impact over the next three years. If you haven't seen already, you'll notice in the photos from the inaugural flight, the British-themed tea toast in front of the first plane once it arrived.

Other celebrations included Frontier Airlines' 10-year anniversary in May and the grand opening of the new Braxton Brewing Taproom in Concourse A in April. In the last update we shared, FEAM Aero and Epic Flight Academy are partnering to build an aircraft mechanic school on campus. That groundbreaking ceremony took place in April and construction is moving along. One of our main objectives in our five-year strategic plan is to leverage partnerships and collaborations. The Epic partnership ensures we are growing air service, preparing the future workforce, and enhancing our reputation with customers.

AMERICAN AND DELTA TO SERVE CANCUN THIS DECEMBER



FRONTIER 10-YEAR ANNIVERSARY / NEW PASSENGER SERVICE / GENERAL AIR CARGO FACILITY DEVELOPMENT

It's hard to believe it, but we celebrated Frontier Airlines' 10-year anniversary in May. Frontier was the first low-cost carrier to start service at CVG with a nonstop flight to Denver. Since that time, the airline has grown, and travelers throughout the region have taken advantage of the airline's low fares and variety of nonstop destinations. This activity has helped CVG become the lowest fare airport in the region the last six years.

Our other new airline, Breeze Airways, started nonstop service to Richmond, VA, and BreezeThru service to Jacksonville, FL, in May. Breeze now serves six destinations from CVG. American and Delta announced service to Cancun, which will start in December. Delta also announced it would restart service to Raleigh-Durham in September.

Last year, we demolished old cargo facilities to make way for new infrastructure for cargo carriers and freight forwarders. We were happy to announce a new partnership with Burrell Aviation to develop an air cargo facility with airside access in that space. This will expand general cargo handling capacity at CVG.

NEW AIRCRAFT MECHANIC SCHOOL / BRAXTON OPENS TAPROOM / FIRST RESPONDER SYMPOSIUM

High-paying aircraft mechanic jobs are on the horizon for students who attend the new school currently under construction at CVG. Our partners, Epic Aviation and FEAM Aero, are investing \$7 million to build the Epic Flight Academy on the south side of campus, behind the CVG Centre. Upon graduation, these students will have the opportunity to land a job at FEAM Aero, which is experiencing rapid growth providing maintenance services to both cargo and passenger airlines at CVG. Construction on their massive second hangar on campus is expected to be completed by the end of 2023 and will create 250 new positions.

Local brewery, Braxton Brewing Company, opened its newest taproom in Concourse A in April. The family-friendly establishment serves breakfast, lunch, and dinner in addition to its 12 rotating beers, wine, and cocktails. Recently featured in the beer rotation was a brew made to commemorate CVG's new British Airways flight, called Hops Over the Pond.

First responders experience chronic high stress and are at-risk of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and other behavioral health conditions. In May, the airport's fire department, with other partners, hosted the second annual symposium for all Cincy region first responders to focus on their mental and physical health.
